yawn

symbol

something visible that is used to represent something else

brave

adj. showing courage or fearlessness in the face of danger, difficulty, or adversity

synonym: courageous, valiant, heroic

(1) brave soldier, (2) brave decision

The **brave** firefighter rescued the family from the burning building.

knight

 a mounted soldier in the past, typically one of noble birth trained to fight in armor; (today in Great Britain) a person honored by the sovereign for personal merit

synonym: noble, cavalier, chevalier

In medieval Europe, a monarch or feudal lord granted the title of the **knight** to a warrior who had demonstrated skill and bravery in battle.

faint

adj. not strong, clear, or vigorous; slight or weak synonym: slight, vague, soft

dismay

 a feeling of discouragement, distress, or anxiety caused by something unexpected or unwelcome; a sudden loss of courage or confidence

Christ

 the man that Christians believe is the prophet and the son of God, and whose life and sermons form the basis for Christianity

Christmas is the day to celebrate the birth of Christ.

desert

- arid land with little or no vegetation often covered with sand or rocks
- (1) desert basin, (2) oasis in the desert

This region is predominantly **desert**.

demon

n. an evil spirit, supernatural being or entity often depicted as malevolent or harmful

synonym: fiend, devil, evil spirit

(1) demon hunter, (2) cast demon eyes

infect

v. to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

acedia

 a state of spiritual or mental apathy, indifference, or lack of motivation; a feeling of listlessness or boredom; a term historically associated with monasticism and often described as a form of spiritual sloth or fatigue *synonym*: sloth, apathy, laziness

(1) spiritual acedia, (2) existential acedia

The long-term unemployment took a toll on her mental health, leading to a sense of **acedia** and hopelessness.

lethargy

 a lack of energy or enthusiasm; a state of being sluggish or drowsy; apathy or inactivity

synonym: listlessness, fatigue, torpor

(1) lethargy symptoms, (2) lethargy feeling

The **lethargy** from the medication made it hard for him to focus on his work.

intense

adj. (especially of a feeling) very strong; extremely sharp or severe

synonym: extreme, fierce, harsh

(1) **intense** heat, (2) develop **intense** itching

That statement by the prime minister drew **intense** international criticism.

leisure

 the freedom provided by the absence of pressures or responsibilities

synonym: relaxation, rest, downtime

(1) leisure activity, (2) a person of leisure

I like to spend my **leisure** time playing sports or reading on weekends.

improve

v. to make or become better

synonym: enhance, ameliorate, enrich

(1) **improve** a process, (2) **improve** the test score

We want to **improve** ties between our two countries.

madden

v. to make someone extremely angry or irritated, often to the point of losing control or rationality; to become irrational or frenzied with anger or frustration

synonym: infuriate, enrage, exasperate

(1) **madden** with rage, (2) **madden** the enemy

The slow internet connection **maddened** him as he tried to stream his favorite show.

dissatisfy

- to fail to satisfy someone
- synonym: disappoint, disgruntle, dishearten

plain

adj. without being decorated in any way; (Noun) a vast expanse of flat land with few trees

synonym: basic, straight, bare

develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) **develop** a strategy, (2) **develop** a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

cognitive

adj. of or relating to mental processes of understanding *synonym*: perceivable, mind, mental

(1) improve **cognitive** function, (2) research on **cognitive** psychology

His **cognitive** faculties were getting worse because of a lack of sleep.

immense

adj. extremely large or great

synonym: enormous, giant, huge

(1) immense amount, (2) immense pressure

He left his wife an **immense** fortune.

complexity

 the state or quality of being complicated or intricate and difficult to understand

synonym: intricacy, sophistication, elaboration

(1) cognitive complexity, (2) complexity theory

The project's **complexity** made it difficult for the team to complete it on time.

elastic

adj. flexible, resilient, or adaptable; (noun) a stretchy material or band that can be stretched and then returned to its original shape; something that is flexible and adaptable

synonym: stretchy, flexible, resilient

(1) elastic body, (2) elastic waistband

The skin of a snake is remarkably **elastic**, allowing it to slither through tight spaces.

biology

- the scientific study of life and the natural processes of living things

inherit

v. to receive money, property, or a title from someone after they have died

phenomenon

 something that exists and can be perceptible, especially one that is not fully understood

synonym: marvel, wonder, splendor

concept

- n. an idea or principle associated with something abstractsynonym: idea, notion, vision
- (1) learn new concepts, (2) concept car

One such rapidly growing **concept** is quantum cryptography.

neuroscience

- the scientific study of the function, structure, and disorder of the brain and the nervous system
- (1) the branch of **neuroscience**, (2) a theoretical concept in **neuroscience**

dynamic

relation

argue

v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

synonym: debate, dispute, quarrel

historic

adj. famous or significant in history, or potentially so *synonym*: memorable, momentous, historical

 a deep conviction in a supernatural power that controls human destiny

synonym: faith, creed, belief

gender

n. the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

ethnicity

 the cultural characteristics of a particular group, such as language, religion, and traditions, that distinguish them from other groups

- v. to import or export something or someone without paying appropriate customs duties, often illegally

garret

 a small and usually cramped attic room, typically located at the top of a house or building; a makeshift living space or studio, often used by artists or writers
