sneak

gunpoint

the point of a gun, used as a threat or in an armed robbery

synonym: point, muzzle

held at gunpoint, (2) gunpoint robbery
 The robbers demanded money from the store clerk at gunpoint.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

innovate

- synonym: bring in, introduce, found
- (1) **innovate** a new method, (2) **innovate** the quality of his life

Companies developing self-driving cars consistently **innovate** the emerging technologies.

sow

reap

convict
