#### inhabitant

- n. a person or an animal that lives in a particular placesynonym: dweller, occupant, resident

# hyperconnected

adj. having multiple, complex links or relationships between different people, objects, or systems

synonym: highly connected, fully connected

(1) **hyperconnected** network, (2) **hyperconnected** technology

The world has become increasingly **hyperconnected**, with the internet and social media playing a significant role in communication and information exchange.

### interdependent

adj. depending on each other; mutually reliant or interconnected

synonym: interconnected, interrelated, mutual

(1) **interdependent** systems, (2) develop **interdependent** skills

In nature, all living things are **interdependent** and rely on each other for survival.

### pollute

 to make an area or substance, such as land, air, water, etc., dirty or harmful to living things by adding waste matter or harmful chemicals

synonym: contaminate, corrupt, degrade

#### reckon

synonym: trite, mundane, dull

### imaginative

*adj.* having or showing new and creative ideas *synonym*: creative, innovative, inventive

#### harmonize

- v. to bring into agreement or concord; to make compatible synonym: reconcile, balance, match
