# disrespect

- an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something
- synonym: impoliteness, rudeness, insult

# dignify

v. to make something worthy of respect or honor; to elevate or give importance to something that may otherwise be considered insignificant

synonym: elevate, ennoble, honor

(1) **dignify** the role, (2) **dignify** the occasion It's important to **dignify** other people's opinions and not dismiss them without consideration.

#### cassava

 a starchy, tuberous root plant that is native to South America and is grown in many tropical and subtropical regions around the world

synonym: manioc, yuca

(1) cassava flour, (2) cassava starch

**Cassava** leaves are also eaten as a vegetable in some parts of the world.

### perpetual

adj. continuing for an extended period in the same way without stopping or being interrupted

*synonym*: enduring, unchanging, incessant

(1) **perpetual** motion machine, (2) **perpetual** struggle The company employs a **perpetual** inventory system.

scot

 a tax or payment, particularly a share or portion of something; a person from Scotland or a Scottish immigrant

synonym: tax, charge, toll

(1) pay annual **scot**, (2) traditional **Scot** attire

The **scot-free** suspect was later apprehended for a different crime.

### grandparent

- n. a parent of one's father or mother
- (1) great- **grandparent**, (2) person of **grandparent** age She was close to her paternal **grandparents** and often spent summers with them.

#### roast

v. to cook food by surrounding it with hot, dry air, especially in an oven

synonym: bake, broil, grill

(1) roast coffee beans, (2) roast beef

The chef **roasted** the chicken to perfection in the oven.

#### yam

- n. a starchy tuber vegetable, native to Africa and Asia, often prepared as a side dish or in stews and soupssynonym: sweet potato, tuber, root
- (1) yam plantation, (2) yam dish

The sweet taste of roasted **yams** is one of my favorite autumn flavors.

# undergird

- v. to provide support or a foundation for something, often by strengthening or reinforcing a structure or systemsynonym: support, underpin, reinforce
- (1) **undergird** your argument, (2) **undergird** the ship A strong foundation of customer satisfaction **undergirds** the business's success.

#### mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

*synonym*: attitude, ethos, mentality

(1) flexible **mindset**, (2) the **mindset** in an education system

Countries whose goal is economic development often focus on fostering an entrepreneurial **mindset** in each individual.

falter

- v. to hesitate or stumble in action or speech; to lose strength or momentum; to become unsteady or shakysynonym: hesitate, stumble, waver
- (1) **falter** in decision-making, (2) **falter** in speech My confidence began to **falter** as I gave my presentation in front of the class.

#### assimilate

to take in and understand information or ideas; to integrate

*synonym*: absorb, incorporate, integrate

assimilate into society, (2) assimilate a language
 The immigrant struggled to assimilate into the new culture.

#### scorch

v. to burn the surface of something, usually accidentally, with a hot iron or flame

synonym: char, burn, singe

(1) **scorch** your clothes, (2) careful not to **scorch** 

The sun **scorched** the desert, making it uninhabitable.

#### millet

- a tiny seed of any of several annual cereal types of grass used as food, mainly to manufacture flour and to feed birds and animals
- (1) increasing **millet** harvests, (2) cooking **millet**The primary crop harvested during autumn is **millet**.

#### hectare

- n. a unit of area equal to 10,000 square meters
- (1) **hectare** land, (2) housing per **hectare**The farm spans over 100 **hectares** of land.

#### dedicate

v. to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

*synonym*: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He dedicated his life to helping others.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effortsynonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

#### **lucrative**

adj. producing a great deal of profit; financially rewarding synonym: profitable, moneymaking, remunerative

(1) **lucrative** deal, (2) **lucrative** market Investing in real estate can be a **lucrative** business if done correctly.

### intrigue

v. to make someone interested, especially by being strange, unusual, or mysterious; to make a secret plan with other people to harm someone

synonym: attract, captivate, charm

(1) intrigue him, (2) intrigue against his rival

The artist's innovative style of work **intrigues** me.

#### intimidation

n. the act of instilling fear or anxiety in someone, often to make them feel inferior or submissive; the use of threats or coercion to deter someone from taking a certain course of action

synonym: frightening, bullying, harassment

(1) act of intimidation, (2) fear of intimidation

Using **intimidation** tactics in the workplace is unacceptable and should not be tolerated.

# grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny

#### shambles

 a state of complete disorder, chaos, or ruin; an utter mess or failure

#### resuscitate

v. to make someone or something active or vigorous again;

synonym: reawaken, resurrect, rejuvenate

### punitive

adj. relating to or involving punishment or inflicting punishment; aimed at punishing or disciplining

synonym: punishing, retributive, disciplinary

(1) punitive response, (2) punitive damages

His coworkers deemed the **punitive** measures taken against the employee too harsh.

#### **banishment**

 the act of expelling or forcing someone to leave a particular place or social group as a form of punishment, often for political or legal reasons

synonym: exile, expulsion, deportation

(1) banishment from society, (2) self-banishment

The king ordered the **banishment** of the troublemaker from the kingdom.

#### intellect

n. the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

synonym: mind, brightness, cleverness

(1) enrich my intellect, (2) human intellect

Your **intellect** is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

#### choral

adj. sung or performed by a choir; of or relating to a choir or choral music.
