### regret

### struggle

#### reconcile

### attend

### ancestry

### disrespect

an expression of lack of regard or contempt for someone or something

### appreciation

 the act of recognizing and valuing the worth or importance of something or someone; gratitude or thankfulness; an increase in value over time

### environment

 the natural world such as air, water, and land in which humans, animals, and plants live

#### academic

### separate

scot

 a tax or payment, particularly a share or portion of something; a person from Scotland or a Scottish immigrant

### discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

### grandparent

- n. a parent of one's father or mother

### large-scale

### irrigation

- the agricultural practice of supplying land with water through pipes or channels so that crops grow well

### republic

- a state or country in which the people and their elected representatives hold supreme power and which has an elected or nominated president rather than a monarch

### institute

#### tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

#### assimilate

v. to take in and understand information or ideas; to integrate

synonym: absorb, incorporate, integrate

(1) **assimilate** into society, (2) **assimilate** a language The immigrant struggled to **assimilate** into the new culture.

#### harvest

- n. yields of plants in a single growing season; the period of the year when gathering occurs on a farmsynonym: crop, reaping, yield
- (1) a scanty **harvest**, (2) reap a **harvest**During **harvest**, farmers are incredibly busy.

#### scorch

v. to burn the surface of something, usually accidentally, with a hot iron or flame

synonym: char, burn, singe

### desert

- arid land with little or no vegetation often covered with sand or rocks

### experiment

n. the scientific test conducted to observe what happens and gain new knowledge

synonym: experimentation, investigation

#### conduct

- to organize and carry out a particular activity synonym: behave, lead, carry on

### plot

a secret plan or scheme to achieve a specific goal; the plan or main story of a literary work; (verb) to plan secretly, usually something illegal

synonym: scheme, plan, design

(1) **plot** twist, (2) **plot** a revolution

The **plot** of the novel centers around a group of friends who uncover a conspiracy to control the world's water supply.

### technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

*synonym*: approach, procedure, strategy

(1) a technique in martial arts, (2) the technique applied to construction

Jockey's superior **technique** brought him victory.

### grain

- wheat or any other small hard seeds used as a food; a relatively small granular particle of a substance synonym: seed, piece, cereal
- (1) a grain of sand, (2) flour made from grain Ordinary air purifiers cannot adequately remove pollen grains.

#### millet

- a tiny seed of any of several annual cereal types of grass used as food, mainly to manufacture flour and to feed birds and animals
- (1) increasing **millet** harvests, (2) cooking **millet** The primary crop harvested during autumn is **millet**.

### yield

the total output of crops, profits, etc. that are produced;
 (verb) to produce or supply helpful something, such as a profit, an amount of food, or information

synonym: proceeds, harvest, output

(1) corn **yield**, (2) the **yield** on the bond The company's stock gives a high **yield**.

#### hectare

- n. a unit of area equal to 10,000 square meters
- (1) **hectare** land, (2) housing per **hectare**The farm spans over 100 **hectares** of land.

### agriculture

 the practice or science of cultivating the land or raising stock

synonym: farming, husbandry, agribusiness

organic agriculture, (2) intensive agriculture
 Agriculture is the foundation of our economy.

### primary

adj. first or highest in rank, order, or importance; most fundamental or essential; pertaining to the initial or introductory stage of something, such as a school year or election cycle

synonym: chief, main, fundamental

(1) **primary** school, (2) **primary** education

The **primary** cause of the accident was due to the icy road conditions.

### grade

n. a particular level of quality, size, importance, etc.

synonym: score, rate, degree

(1) boys in the twelfth **grade**, (2) students at all **grade** levels Departments may set requirements for a higher **grade** point average.

#### cultivation

n. the process of preparing and using land for growing crops or plants, often involving tilling, fertilizing, and irrigating the soil; the act of fostering or developing something, such as a skill, talent, or idea

synonym: farming, tilling, polish

The <b>cultivation</b> of crops is a	a vital part of agriculture in many

#### modern

adj. of or belonging to the present time or recent times synonym: contemporary, stylish, current

### quest

- n. a long or challenging search for somethingsynonym: exploration, inquisition, pursuit
- (1) the **quest** for truth, (2) on a **quest** for happiness That adventurer traveled in **quest** of buried treasure.

#### dedicate

v. to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He dedicated his life to helping others.

#### advocate

- n. a person who supports or suggests an idea, development, or way of doing somethingsynonym: proponent, exponent, promoter

**Advocates** of abolishing the death penalty often argue that the alternative heaviest sentence should be life in prison.

#### mainstream

 the ideas, opinions, beliefs, etc., that are considered normal or accepted by most people

*synonym*: prevailing, average, common

### policy

n. a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

(1) health **policy**, (2) foreign **policy** 

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

#### sector

 a distinct part or division of something often used to refer to a segment of an economy or industry; an area or field of work or activity

*synonym*: division, department, branch

(1) industrial sector, (2) private sector

The technology **sector** is constantly evolving and innovating.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

#### decision

 the act or process of making up someone's mind about something; a choice or judgment reached after considering options

synonym: choice, determination, judgment

(1) decision authority, (2) a selfish decision

She was struggling to make a **decision** between two job offers.

#### **lucrative**

*adj.* producing a great deal of profit; financially rewarding *synonym*: profitable, moneymaking, remunerative

(1) lucrative deal, (2) lucrative market

Investing in real estate can be a **lucrative** business if done correctly.

### negotiate

v. to have formal discussions with someone to reach an agreement

synonym: discuss, mediate, bargain

(1) **negotiate** a settlement, (2) **negotiate** the price of the house

We are always happy to **negotiate** a discount.

### intrigue

v. to make someone interested, especially by being strange, unusual, or mysterious; to make a secret plan with other people to harm someone

synonym: attract, captivate, charm

(1) **intrigue** him, (2) **intrigue** against his rival The artist's innovative style of work **intrigues** me.

### proposal

- n. a formal suggestion or offer, sometimes a written onesynonym: offer, suggestion, proposition
- an innovative proposal,

   with much opposition.

#### clause

 a group of words containing a subject and a predicate and forming part of a sentence

synonym: article, provision, stipulation

(1) clause in contract, (2) a main clause

The contract had a **clause** that specified penalties for late delivery.

### aim

- v. to try or plan to get or achieve something synonym: aspire, direct, target
- (1) **aim** at a specific target, (2) **aim** to be a nurse We **aim** for an overseas expansion.

#### exhausted

adj. extremely tired

synonym: drowsy, depleted, fatigued

(1) the **exhausted** food sources, (2) **exhausted** parents The **exhausted** runner fell to the ground and gasped.

### privilege

 a special right or advantage that only one person or group of people has, usually because they are rich and powerful in a society

synonym: benefit, authorization, advantage

(1) a breach of **privilege**, (2) **privilege** of membership In the Middle Ages, the right to hunt in the wild was the **privilege** of royalty and nobility.

#### session

 a formal meeting or series of meetings for the execution of a particular group's functions; a period spent doing a particular activity

synonym: conference, gathering

(1) the morning **session**, (2) the court **session** Parliament is now in **session**.

#### intimidation

n. the act of instilling fear or anxiety in someone, often to make them feel inferior or submissive; the use of threats or coercion to deter someone from taking a certain course of action

synonym: frightening, bullying, harassment

(1) act of **intimidation**, (2) fear of **intimidation**Using **intimidation** tactics in the workplace is unacceptable and should not be tolerated.

### grandchild

- n. a child of someone's son or daughtersynonym: offspring, descendant, progeny
