explode

v. to burst or break open violently and noisily; to cause something to burst or break open

synonym: detonate, blast, rupture

scramble

 to move or climb quickly and awkwardly, often using your hands to help you

synonym: jumble, disarrange

(1) **scramble** my mind, (2) **scramble** for support Local business owners **scrambled** to find skilled workers.

haunt

v. to frequent or visit repeatedly, often in a way that is disturbing or unsettling; to occupy or fill the mind, often in a way that is unpleasant or persistent

synonym: stalk, spook, obsess

The crowd's boos and jeers continued to **haunt** the performer long after the show ended.

sergeant

 a rank of non-commissioned officer in the armed forces, typically above corporal but below staff sergeant or sergeant first class

synonym: officer, serjeant, noncommissioned officer
