#### vertebrate

adj. relating to animals that have a backbone or spinal column, such as mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, and fish

synonym: animal, chordate, backboned

(1) the muscle tissue of a **vertebrate**, (2) **vertebrate** biology The presence of a backbone is a defining characteristic of **vertebrate** animals.

#### devote

v. to commit or dedicate oneself or one's time, effort, or energy to a particular task or purpose

synonym: commit, dedicate, apply

(1) **devote** all of my energies, (2) **devote** my own life He **devoted** himself to studying the history of ancient civilizations.

#### uncover

v. to remove the cover from something; to discover something previously unseen or hidden

synonym: disclose, reveal, unveil

(1) **uncover** a potential problem, (2) **uncover** the truth He continued his investigation and soon **uncovered** another crime.

#### mediate

v. to try to bring about an agreement or understanding between people who are in conflict

synonym: arbitrate, reconcile, intervene

(1) **mediate** allergic reaction, (2) **mediate** a negotiation The teacher had to **mediate** a disagreement between two students over a stolen pencil.

aroma

a distinctive, usually pleasant smell, often of a specific food, plant, or object

synonym: fragrance, scent, smell

(1) aroma therapy, (2) coffee aroma

The **aroma** of freshly baked bread filled the kitchen.

#### bloodstream

- *n.* the blood flowing through the body
- (1) **bloodstream** in an artery, (2) **bloodstream** to the brain Cancer cells are often carried throughout the body by the **bloodstream**.

#### chemo

 short for chemotherapy, a treatment for cancer that uses drugs to destroy cancer cells

*synonym*: chemotherapy, antineoplastic

(1) chemo patient, (2) chemo-radiotherapy

The side effects of **chemo**, such as nausea and hair loss, were a major concern for the patient.

#### metabolite

 a substance produced by metabolic processes in living organisms, especially those that are essential for normal physiological functions

*synonym*: intermediate

(1) **metabolite** concentration, (2) drug **metabolite** The liver **metabolite** levels were higher than usual.

#### pancreas

n. a glandular organ in the digestive system that produces several important hormones, including insulin and glucagon, as well as digestive enzymes that help break down food in the small intestine

synonym: gland, organ, islet

(1) **pancreas** inflammation, (2) **pancreas** function The endocrine function of the **pancreas** involves the secretion of hormones such as insulin.

#### reinvent

v. to change something so drastically that it looks to be completely new

synonym: recreate, remake, revive

synonym: smell, inhale, scent

#### inhale

 the maintenance of stability or balance within an organism or system through various physiological processes that regulate internal conditions, such as temperature and pH

*synonym*: balance, equilibrium, stability

(1) cellular **homeostasis**, (2) **homeostasis** imbalance The body's ability to maintain **homeostasis** is essential for survival in harsh environments.

#### microbiota

 (also "flora") the community of microorganisms that live within a particular environment or host organism, including bacteria, viruses, fungi, and other microorganisms

synonym: microflora, microbiome
