circumvent

v. to go around, avoid, or bypass something, often to achieve an intended goal or objective; to outmaneuver or outsmart a person or obstacle

synonym: evade, bypass, outsmart

(1) **circumvent** rules, (2) **circumvent** authority I took a back road to work on time to **circumvent** the traffic jam.

impatience

 a feeling of restlessness or irritation caused by a desire for something to happen or be done more quickly; lack of patience

synonym: impatience, restlessness, agitation

(1) **impatience** with delays, (2) business **impatience**The doctor advised him to manage his **impatience** as stress could exacerbate his medical condition.

spoil

v. to ruin the taste, appearance, or quality of something; to become or cause something to become rotten or bad

synonym: rot, decay, deteriorate

(1) **spoil** a person's sport, (2) **spoil** the surprise If you leave the milk out of the refrigerator for too long, it will **spoil**.

overused

adj. used too often or too much, to the point of becoming cliched; lacking originality

synonym: overworked, overutilized, exhausted

(1) overused common, (2) overused cliché

The concept of time travel has become **overused** in science fiction and fantasy, with many movies and books exploring the idea.

rev

n. a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per minute

synonym: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- rev engine, (2) rev up the crowd

He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud **rev**.

alarming

adj. causing concern or apprehension; causing a feeling of danger, harm, or emergency; unsettling or disturbingsynonym: forbidding, concerning, disturbing

(1) alarming news, (2) alarming statistics

The sudden rise in crime rates in our neighborhood is quite **alarming**.

dismal

adj. depressing or dreary; causing or showing unhappiness or despair

synonym: gloomy, depressing, dreary

villager

 a person who lives in a village or small rural community;
 a person who is part of a close-knit and traditional community

synonym: resident, inhabitant, countryperson

roam

biodegrade

- to decay naturally by microorganisms, such as bacteria and fungi

footprint

- a mark of a foot, shoe, or animal's foot left on a surface *synonym*: footmark, imprint, impression
- (1) **footprints** in the snow, (2) the **footprints** of an earlier civilization

We choose transportation that has a smaller carbon **footprint**.

edible

- adj. fit or safe to be eaten; able to be consumed as food synonym: esculent, comestible, digestible
- (1) non-edible ingredients, (2) edible vegetables I made sure to pick only edible mushrooms for our dinner.

to receive money, property, or a title from someone after they have died

synonym: obtain, gain, acquire

(1) **inherit** estate, (2) **inherit** ancestral property After his death, his sons **inherited** his business.

ancestor

- a person from whom one is descended; a forefather *synonym*: forebear, forefather, progenitor
