- the scientific study of the function, structure, and disorder of the brain and the nervous system
- (1) the branch of **neuroscience**, (2) a theoretical concept in **neuroscience**

#### brainwave

 a sudden idea or inspiration; a moment of great insight or creativity

*synonym*: inspiration, brainstorm, revelation

(1) brainwave idea, (2) sudden brainwave

The engineer had a **brainwave** and redesigned the product to be more efficient.

#### flickering

adj. shining or flashing in an unsteady or irregular way;
 fluctuating or wavering, often with regards to light or flame

synonym: shining, flashing, twinkling

(1) flickering flames, (2) flickering hope

The **flickering** candlelight added a cozy ambiance to the room.

#### flicker

- v. to shine unsteadily or intermittently, as if with a faint light synonym: flash, spark, glimmer
- (1) **flicker** every two seconds, (2) **flicker** out like a candle The fireflies **flickered** in the darkness.

#### resonate

v. to be filled with a deep echoing sound

synonym: echo, reverberate, resound

(1) deeply **resonate** with the consumers, (2) **resonate** in the same frequency

The sound **resonates** well in this theater.

#### distract

 to draw someone's attention away from what they are trying to do

synonym: divert, preoccupy, confuse

(1) **distract** attention from the real issue, (2) **distract** public opinion

Please don't distract me while I'm studying.

#### illiterate

adj. unable to read or write; lacking basic education and knowledge in reading and writing

synonym: unlettered, uneducated, unschooled

(1) **illiterate** population, (2) computer- **illiterate**Despite attending school, he remained **illiterate** and unable to read or write.
