bush

## accompany

#### remission

- a period of time when a disease or condition is no longer present or active; a lessening or reduction of symptoms or intensity; forgiveness or pardon for sins or debts

#### was in remission.

#### remarkable

*adj.* worthy of attention because unusual or special *synonym*: outstanding, exceptional, extraordinary

## provocative

adj. arousing anger, interest, or another strong reaction, especially deliberately

synonym: instigating, provoking, inciting

## penicillin

 an antibiotic drug derived from mold and used to treat bacterial infections

synonym: antibiotic, bacitracin

(1) **penicillin** allergy, (2) **penicillin** sensitivity testing The doctor prescribed **penicillin** to treat the bacterial infection.

#### bold

adj. brave, daring, and confident; not frightened of danger or afraid to say what you feel or to take risks

synonym: brave, courageous, fearless

The effort to alleviate climate change needs **bold** action.

## exciting

adj. causing a lot of interest or excitement synonym: exhilarating, stimulating, thrilling

## snuggle

#### missile

#### dense

mow

#### molecule
