stressor

infrequent

fetus

womb

trajectory

the curved path followed by an object moving through space

synonym: course, curve, orbit

doula

 a trained professional who provides emotional, physical, and informational support to individuals, typically women, before, during, and after childbirth

synonym: birth companion, childbirth assistant

(1) postpartum **doula**, (2) trained **doula**The mother hired an experienced **doula** to provide emotional and physical support during childbirth.

childbirth

- n. the act or process of giving birth to a babysynonym: delivery, labor, parturition
