#### relate

# palm

# clammy

#### **sweat**

 the salty liquid that is produced by the glands in the skin, especially when the body is hot or under stress

She wiped the **sweat** off her forehead with a towel.

#### breath

the air that is taken into and expelled from your lungs;
 the process of taking into and expelling air from your lungs

*synonym*: air, puff, whiff

(1) hold your **breath**, (2) **breath** of wind

He bated his **breath** when talking about this affair.

### shallow

adj. not having much distance from the top to the bottom synonym: superficial, external, surface

(1) **shallow** people, (2) **shallow** water **Shallow** brooks are noisier than deep rivers.

### obvious

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

(1) **obvious** reasons, (2) his conclusion was **obvious** There are **obvious** differences between the two wine-producing regions.

#### stream

 a small, narrow river; a continuous flow of something, such as liquid, gas, people, vehicles, etc.

*synonym*: flow, current, brook

(1) the **stream** of time, (2) an endless **stream** of cars

Jet **streams** are the common name for air currents that form high in the atmosphere.

#### mechanism

 a part of a machine, or a set of parts that performs a task; a natural or established process that occurs during a specific situation or reaction synonym: means, method, system

(1) the **mechanism** for DNA replication, (2) defense **mechanism** 

He discovered unique **mechanisms** for photochemical reactions.

#### nervous

adj. worried and anxious about something; relating to the nerves

*synonym*: neural, anxious, uneasy

(1) development of the **nervous** system, (2) get **nervous** He suffers from **nervous** breakdowns.

#### flood

a large amount of water flowing beyond its normal limits;
 an overwhelming number or amount

synonym: deluge, downpour, overflow

(1) **flood** advisory, (2) a **flood** of questions

These heavy rains caused flash **floods** on several islands.

#### hormone

- a chemical substance made by organs that encourages or influences the development, growth, sex, etc., of an animal and is carried around the body in the blood
- hormone secretion, (2) female hormone
   The doctor diagnosed me with a hormone disorder.

#### cortisol

 a hormone produced by the adrenal gland that is involved in regulating the body's metabolism, immune system, and blood pressure

synonym: stress hormone, hydrocortisone

(1) cortisol stress, (2) excessive cortisol

**Cortisol** levels in the body are often elevated during times of stress.

#### adrenaline

n. (also "epinephrine") a substance secreted by the adrenal medulla in response to stress, which makes the heart beat faster and prepares the body to react to danger

*synonym*: epinephrine

The band has released a lot of **adrenaline-pumping** rock music.

#### bloodstream

- n. the blood flowing through the body

# oxygen

- n. the chemical element with the symbol O that is present in air and water and is necessary for people, animals, and plants to live

### overload

# infrequent

# well-being

#### survival

 the state of continuing to exist or live, frequently in the face of difficulty or danger

synonym: endurance, continuity

#### examine

relation

v. to study or consider a person or object attentively and thoroughly to learn something about them

synonym: study, probe, analyze

synonym: association, linkage, connection

#### disease

 a disorder or illness that affects the body or mind, often characterized by specific symptoms or abnormal functioning of organs or systems

#### cancer

 abnormal growth of cells that can invade and destroy surrounding tissues and organs; a disease characterized by the uncontrolled growth and spread of abnormal cells

#### interfere

# process

(1) **process** improvement, (2) decision-making **process** The **process** for applying for a visa can be lengthy and complicated.

# pregnant

adj. having a baby or young animal developing in the uterussynonym: expectant

She vacated the position when she got pregnant.

# develop

v. to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) **develop** a strategy, (2) **develop** a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

fetus

- an unborn or unhatched animal in the later stages of development showing the main recognizable features of the mature animal
- (1) development of the **fetus**, (2) an aborted **fetus**

The female vagina is elastic enough to allow the passage of a **fetus**.

#### labor

n. productive work, especially physical work done for wages; the people who do manual or physical work in a country or company for wage; (verb) to work hard or to strive and make an effort to reach a goal

In several countries, child **labor** is a serious social problem.

#### communicate

 to share or exchange information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other signals

#### womb

#### cascade

# relax

# prop

### discriminate

#### maternal

adj. relating to or characteristic of a mother; having feelings that are typical of a caring mother towards her child

# journalist

#### alarm

- v. to suggest that someone or something would be a suitable fit for a particular purpose or role
- synonym: advise, suggest, instruct

# prenatal

adj. of, relating to, or occurring in the period before birth synonym: antecedent, preconception, prebirth

(1) **prenatal** checkup, (2) **prenatal** development **Prenatal** care is essential for ensuring the health of both mother and baby.

#### suffer

 to experience pain, distress, or hardship; to undergo or endure something painful or unpleasant

synonym: endure, undergo, tolerate

#### racism

n. prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against a person or people based on their membership in a particular ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized

#### stretch

# grandparent

 a building or hospital department where people can go for medical care or advice, especially of a particular condition
