## anxiety

#### uncertain

## president

#### deck

#### titanic

## whiskey

 a type of distilled alcoholic beverage made from fermented grains, typically barley, corn, rye, or wheat, aged in barrels and often consumed straight or with mixers

#### ridiculous

## biology

- the scientific study of life and the natural processes of living things

## evolutionary

adj. relating to or denoting how living things develop or change from earlier forms

synonym: developmental, mutative, transformative

#### interaction

the act of connecting with someone, mainly when working, playing, or spending time with them

## choreography

#### altruism

## identity

## responsible

## forgiveness

*n*. the act of stopping feeling angry or resentful towards someone for a mistake or offense with compassion

## undergraduate

 a student who is studying for their first degree at a university or other higher education institution

## philosophy

- the study of general and fundamental questions, such as those about existence, reason, knowledge, values, mind

## ontology

 a branch of metaphysics concerned with the nature of being and the existence

synonym: metaphysics, philosophy of being, study of existence

## angst

 a feeling of deep anxiety or dread, typically an unfocused one about the human condition or the state of the world in general

synonym: anxiety, worry, stress

#### terrific

adj. causing terror or fear; extremely great or intense; very good or excellent

#### obsess

## thorough

## unpleasant

## courtyard

 an open space surrounded by buildings or walls, often in the center of a building or group of buildings

#### radiate

v. to spread out or emit something, such as light or heat, in all directions

### experiment

## absolutely

## fascinating

adj. extremely interestingsynonym: alluring, intriguing, captivating

## inaugurate

v. to formally begin or initiate something, particularly a new project, organization, government, or system, often through an official ceremony

#### screed

## quotation

## equivalent

## parliament

 a legislative body, especially the one that represents the people of a country or state

synonym: congress, assembly, legislature

#### monument

 a statue, building, or other structure erected to commemorate a person or event

synonym: memorial, marker, statue

(1) humanity's **monument**, (2) **monument** honoring

#### outset

- n. the beginning of somethingsynonym: beginning, start, initiation

## immigrant

 a person who has come to a country where they were not born to live there permanently

synonym: settler, expatriate, emigrant

#### grant

v. to agree to give or allow somebody

synonym: allocate, authorize, give

## **immigration**

synonym: migration, settlement, emigration

The **immigration** policy in this country is stringent, making it difficult for many people to obtain a visa.

#### threaten

 to utter intentions of injury or punishment against someone

synonym: endanger, terrorize, intimidate

(1) **threaten** a healthy relationship, (2) **threaten** national security

Various artificially induced causes are **threatening** our ecosystem.

#### **Jewish**

adj. of or relating to people whose traditional religion is Judaism

synonym: Judaic

(1) Jewish history, (2) Jewish culture

My friend is a **Jewish** woman who celebrates Hanukkah every year.

#### scatter

- v. to cause to separate and go in different directions synonym: disperse, spread, bestrew
- (1) **scatter** seeds, (2) **scatter** around the internet The hunter's approach **scattered** the geese.

#### disperse

v. to spread out or distribute over a broad region, or to cause something to do so

*synonym*: dissipate, spread, scatter

#### exile

the state of being forced to leave one's country or home,
 typically for political or punitive reasons

synonym: banishment, expulsion, deportation

#### festival

 a celebration or event, usually marking a particular religious or cultural occasion, often involving processions, music, dancing, and the performance of plays or other artistic works

leaven

 a substance, such as yeast or baking powder, that causes dough or batter to rise and become light and spongy during baking

synonym: yeast, ferment, sourdough

#### affliction

 a condition of physical or mental suffering or distress, often caused by illness, injury, or other adversity; a burden or trouble that causes hardship or grief

## herb

## aspiration

## phrase

a group of words that mean something specific when used together

synonym: expression, idiom, term

## magical

*adj.* produced by or containing supernatural powers *synonym*: enchanting, occult, supernatural

(1) magical place, (2) magical powers

When I was a child, my mother often cast **magical** spells to ease my pain whenever I was injured.

## utopia

 an ideal and perfect society in which all social and political problems have been solved, and all members live in harmony and prosperity

synonym: paradise, heaven, Arcadia

(1) perfect **utopia**, (2) a **utopia** for an engineer

The concept of **utopia** is often viewed as an impossible or unrealistic goal, as it goes beyond what is currently possible.

#### convinced

adj. completely certain about something; having a strong belief or conviction in a particular religionsynonym: confident, positive, indoctrinated

#### absence

 the fact or condition of being away from a place where they are typically anticipated to be

#### counterintuitive

*adj.* contrary to what common sense would suggest *synonym*: unreasonable, paradoxical, nonsensical

#### invulnerable

adj. incapable of being harmed, injured, or damaged; immune to attack or damage

## replace

valley
