 a type of question that describes something in a difficult and confusing way, and that has a surprising answer, often asked as a game

synonym: mystery, puzzle, enigma

The **riddle** remains mysterious to us.

appease

 to pacify or soothe someone, usually by agreeing to their demands or requests; to calm someone's anger or anxiety

synonym: pacify, calm, soothe

(1) appease hunger, (2) appease her fears

The manager tried to **appease** the angry customer by offering them a refund.

overlord

 a person who has great power over many other people, especially in the past

synonym: master, tyrant, autocrat

(1) evil overlord, (2) colonial overlord

In the feudal system, the **overlord** owned most of the wealth.

artifact

 a person-made object, especially one of historical or cultural interest



synonym: antique, relic, heirloom

paleolithic artifacts, (2) Peruvian artifacts
 The museum has a vast collection of Greek artifacts.

inscription

 a message or design that is written or engraved on a surface of something, such as stone or metal

synonym: engraving, writing, script

(1) **inscription** on a plaque, (2) funerary **inscriptions**The ancient coin had an **inscription** in Latin and a picture of the emperor on the other side.

decipher

v. to read or understand something that is written in code or in a difficult or obscure way

synonym: interpret, decode, translate

(1) **decipher** code, (2) **decipher** message
He spent hours trying to **decipher** the ancient text.

downright

adj. (especially of something bad) complete and absolute;
 utter; (adverb) completely and absolutely

synonym: absolute, utter, complete

(1) **downright** nonsense, (2) **downright** impossible It was a **downright** lie that he would attend the event.

confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

meaningless

adj. having no meaning, direction, or purposesynonym: pointless, absurd, senseless

(1) a **meaningless** endeavor, (2) do a **meaningless** task This experiment's results are **meaningless** because the other conditions are not identical.

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

takeoff

 a departure, especially of airplanes; the initial ascent of an airplane as it becomes airborne

synonym: leaving, departure, liftoff

(1) vertical takeoff, (2) takeoff run

Our aircraft is now ready for takeoff.
