### ache

 to experience a dull, persistent pain or discomfort, typically of moderate or low intensity; to feel a continuous dull pain

synonym: hurt, throb, smart

### intermittent

adj. occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady; stopping and starting periodically; sporadic

synonym: sporadic, irregular, periodic

The **intermittent** rain made it difficult to plan a picnic.

### burnout

n. the state of being exceedingly exhausted or unwell, either physically or mentally, as a result of overworking synonym: breakdown, exhaustion, fatigue

### exhaustion

 the state of being extremely tired and lacking energy or strength

synonym: fatigue, weariness, tiredness

### detachment

a state of being disconnected or disinterested;
 impartiality or emotional distance; a military unit or formation that separates from a larger force and operates independently

### dishearten

- to cause someone to lose hope, confidence, or enthusiasm; to discourage or demoralize
- synonym: discourage, dismay, demoralize

The team's loss in the semifinals did not **dishearten** their determination to return stronger next season.

### helpless

adj. unable to take care of oneself or to do things without help

synonym: defenseless, powerless, susceptible

#### sever

v. to break or separate something by cutting, especially suddenly and forcibly

synonym: cut apart, separate, detach

(1) **sever** a rope, (2) **sever** a positive relationship He **severed** a branch from a tree quickly.

### predominant

adj. having control, authority, or influence that is greater than that of others; prevailing or vastly more abundant than others of the same kind

synonym: cardinal, prevailing, superior

(1) **predominant** color, (2) a **predominant** species In this office, teamwork is the **predominant** factor in

#### raft

- a flat structure, usually made of logs or planks, that can be used for transport or as a platform for swimmer
   synonym: flatboat, boat, barge
- (1) a **raft** for carrying horses, (2) a life **raft** The rubber **raft** was swept out to sea.

### resilient

- adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions
- synonym: robust, sturdy, tough
- (1) a hard and **resilient** steel, (2) **resilient** population She is a **resilient** person and has always bounced back from setbacks.

### redefine

- to change the meaning or interpretation of something; to make people think about something in a new or different way
- synonym: reconsider, reformulate, alter
- (1) **redefine** customer experience, (2) **redefine** our role The video telephony application has **redefined** the way we work.

#### cultivate

- v. to prepare and foster land for growing crops or plants synonym: boost, foster, nurture
- (1) **cultivate** a field, (2) **cultivate** relationships University is a great place to **cultivate** our minds and expertise.

### empathy

- n. the ability to share another person's feelings or experiences by imagining that person's situation
- *synonym*: compassion, sympathy, tenderness

### empower

### shipwreck
