sanatorium

 a medical facility or institution for the long-term treatment or care of people with chronic illnesses or diseases, especially tuberculosis

synonym: health resort, rehab center

(1) military **sanatorium**, (2) **sanatorium** resort In the early 1900s, tuberculosis patients would check into a **sanatorium** for treatment.

surpass

- v. to be or do better than someone or something; to excel or go beyond the limits or standards of something synonym: excel, outdo, outperform
- (1) **surpass** imagination, (2) **surpass** \$20 billion in sales The athlete's record-breaking performance **surpassed** all expectations.

histamine

- a substance produced by the body, sometimes found in foods, that can cause allergic reactions, inflammation, or other physiological responses
- (1) **histamine** reaction, (2) **histamine** blocker His allergies caused **histamine** release in his body, leading to congestion and sneezing.

mania

 a psychological or emotional state that is marked by excessive enthusiasm, excitement, or delusions; a strong and uncontrollable desire or craving for something

synonym: obsession, craze, frenzy

(1) start-up mania, (2) dance mania

The **mania** for collecting rare books led him to spend his savings on a first edition.

repurpose

v. to use something again for a different purpose than it was originally intended

synonym: reutilize, recycle, reuse

(1) **repurpose** an old building, (2) **repurpose** a used car The old barn was **repurposed** into a modern event space.

euphoria

a feeling of intense happiness, excitement, or delight; a state of extreme joy or pleasure

synonym: elevation, bliss, elation

(1) experience **euphoria**, (2) **euphoria-inducing** drug Winning the lottery brought a feeling of **euphoria** to the lucky winner.

preconceived

- adj. (of an idea or opinion) formed beforehand, especially without evidence for its truth or usefulness
- (1) a **preconceived** notion, (2) **preconceived** opinions We should start a discussion from scratch with no **preconceived** ideas.

serotonin

- a neurotransmitter (= a chemical that carries nerve impulses) involved in, e.g., sleep, emotion, and memory
- (1) **serotonin** drug, (2) **serotonin** levels

 The medicine works by boosting **serotonin** levels in the brain.

neurotransmitter

- a chemical that carries nerve impulses between neurons or between neurons and muscles
- (1) neurotransmitter receptor, (2) neurotransmitters

released from the brain

Endorphins are a type of **neurotransmitter** that gives a sense of well-being.

insomnia

the condition of being unable to sleep, usually a chronic one

synonym: sleeplessness, wakefulness, restlessness

He suffered **insomnia** and loss of appetite after he began taking that medication.

painkiller

dramatize

 to present or portray something in a way that emphasizes its dramatic or emotional aspects; to make something into a drama or play

agnostic

 a person who believes that it is impossible to know whether there is a god

synonym: skeptic, doubter, unbeliever

creep

v. to move slowly, quietly, and carefully, usually to avoid being seen or heard

insidious

glutamate

anesthesia

- a state of controlled, temporary loss of bodily sensation or awareness that is induced for medical purposes
- (1) **anesthesia** for surgery, (2) local **anesthesia** He is in general **anesthesia** under the surgeon.

beforehand

adv. ahead of time; in advancesynonym: in advance, preceding, earlier

synonym: extenuate, soothe, relieve

(1) **palliate** symptoms, (2) attempts to **palliate**The charity provided meals and shelter to **palliate** the suffering of the homeless population.

firefighter

- n. a person whose job is to extinguish fires

ketamine

- a medication primarily used as an anesthetic and analgesic, known for its rapid onset and short duration of action, also used in recreational settings as a dissociative and hallucinogenic drug
