telltale

 adj. revealing or betraying information or evidence; serving as a sign or indicator of something

synonym: revealing, indicative, suggestive

(1) telltale evidence, (2) telltale heart

The **telltale** signs of a dishonest employee were missing files and constant delay.

seize

 to catch or take hold of someone or something suddenly and forcibly; to capture the attention or imagination of something

synonym: grab, grasp, capture

(1) **seize** a person's property, (2) **seize** the day

He has the superpower to **seize** a business opportunity.

rev

a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per

minute

synonym: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- rev engine, (2) rev up the crowd

He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud **rev**.

pawn

 a piece in the game of chess that can be moved only forward and captured only diagonally; (verb) leave as a guarantee in return for money

synonym: collateral, pledge, security

(1) pawn checkmate, (2) pawn my jewelry

He used his watch as a **pawn** in the game of chess.

unravel

- v. undo twisted, knitted, or woven threads by separating it synonym: separate, unknot, ravel
- (1) unravel a knit, (2) unravel a plot

Detectives are still attempting to **unravel** the mystery of his death.

prostitute

a person, typically a woman, who engages in sexual activity in exchange for payment

synonym: hooker, harlot, whore

(1) prostitute street, (2) a male prostitute

She turned to **prostitute** to make ends meet.

scorpion

 a small creature similar to an insect with a segmented body, a pair of pincers, and a long, thin tail that ends in a venomous sting

synonym: arachnid, stinger

The **scorpion's** venom can be lethal to humans.

cling

cryptic
