eager

label

concrete

judge

 a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

warn

gripping

 adj. engaging or compelling; capable of holding one's attention or interest tightly; evocative of strong emotions or reactions

tight

adj. fixed, fastened, or kept together firmly or closely synonym: closed, secured, cramped

proceed

v. to move forward or to continue with a process or action; to advance or progress

synonym: advance, progress, move ahead

(1) **proceed** with caution, (2) **proceed** to the next step We can now **proceed** with the next item on our agenda.

loosen

v. to make something less tight, firm, or fixed; to free from restraint or constraint; to relax

synonym: relax, slacken, untie

(1) loosen grip, (2) loosen knot

Please **loosen** the screws on the back panel so we can access the inside of the machine.

grip

- n. the act of holding onto something firmly with your hands, or the ability to do so; (verb) to hold fast or firmlysynonym: grasp, clasp, (verb) hold

curiosity

flaw

n. a fault, mistake, or weakness that causes something not to be perfect

practically

adv. almost or nearly

synonym: almost, nearly, virtually

function

synonym: purpose, mapping, job

brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

organic

synonym: cure, drug, medicine

labor

n. productive work, especially physical work done for wages; the people who do manual or physical work in a country or company for wage; (verb) to work hard or to strive and make an effort to reach a goal

weigh

v. to have a particular weight; to carefully evaluate things before making a conclusion

pound

soil

thread

n. a fine cord of natural or synthetic fibers or filaments, such as cotton or nylon, used in sewing, knitting, or weaving; a series of connected messages or comments on a social media platform or online forum, often related to a particular topic; a sequence or line of events, ideas, or actions that are connected or related; (verb) to pass a thread through a needle or other small opening, in preparation for sewing or stitching

chromosome

 a long and string-like DNA molecule containing the part or all of the genetic material of an organism that controls what an animal or plant is like

syndrome

- n. a group of signs and symptoms that occur together and are characteristic of a particular condition or disordersynonym: disorder, condition, complication

chunk

- n. a thick and solid mass or piece of somethingsynonym: block, lump, piece

delay

v. to cause something to happen at a later time than originally intended or expected

synonym: block, adjourn, detain

disability

- a physical or mental condition that makes it difficult for someone to do some things that other people do
 synonym: impairment, disadvantage, restriction
- (1) a **disability** pension, (2) a learning **disability**Listening to music at a high volume may lead to a hearing **disability**.

equanimity

 a state of calmness, stability, and composure, particularly in the face of stress, adversity, or challenging situations

synonym: calmness, composure, equilibrium

(1) achieve perfect **equanimity**, (2) lose **equanimity**The CEO's **equanimity** during the crisis helped reassure the investors and employees.

unequivocal

- adj. admitting of no doubt; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusionsynonym: apparent, absolute, undeniable

diagnose

despair

the feeling that there is no hope and you cannot do anything to improve a difficult situation

tragic

adj. causing great sadness or suffering; very unfortunate synonym: calamitous, disastrous, catastrophic

(1) tragic love stories, (2) tragic death

The **tragic** events of the war left many families torn apart.

mysterious

adj. difficult to understand, explain, or identify; having an aura of secrecy, intrigue, or puzzlement

synonym: enigmatic, cryptic, puzzling

(1) mysterious object, (2) mysterious stranger The **mysterious** disappearance of the ship remains

unsolved.

tragedy

an event or situation causing great loss, misfortune, or destruction; a play or literature that deals with a severe and sad event and often ends with the death of the main character

synonym: disaster, adversity, calamity

- n.

smirk

rhythm

 a strong regular repeated pattern of sounds, words, or musical notes that are used in music, poetry, and dancing

stunning

adj. causing a strong emotional reaction of admiration,surprise, or shock due to its beauty, rarity, or excellencesynonym: beautiful, breathtaking, magnificent

(1) **stunning** beauty, (2) **stunning** disclosure
The **stunning** sunset took everyone's breath away.

gaze

v. to stare at something or someone for an extended time, usually out of surprise or adoration, or because you are thinking about something else

synonym: stare, gawk, look

calm

presence

 the fact or state that someone or something exists, occurs, or is present

synonym: existence, actuality, fact

occupation

a person's job or profession; the act of taking possession

synonym: job, profession, vocation

(1) **occupation** disease, (2) **occupation** of a building The police stopped the suspicious person and asked him to give his name, address, and **occupation**.

therapy

n. the act of caring for someone through medication, remedial training, etc.

synonym: antidote, medicine, treatment

(1) therapy for a patient, (2) field of gene therapyI underwent aversion therapy for my addiction to alcohol.

neurological

adj. of or relating to the science of neurology or the nervous system

synonym: nervous, neural, brain-related

(1) fever with neurological signs, (2) neurological

symptoms

The patient was diagnosed with a **neurological** disorder affecting their motor skills.

dull

adj. not interesting or exciting; not bright, vivid, or shiny; not active, brisk, or sharp

synonym: insensitive, unintelligent, boring

(1) a dull pain, (2) dull sight

The trade is **dull** right now due to the collapse of the prominent investment bank.

disappoint

to fail to meet someone or their hopes or expectations;
 to make someone feel sad

synonym: sadden, dismay, frustrate

- (1) **disappoint** the audience, (2) don't **disappoint** me She worked very hard not to **disappoint** her boss's expectations.
- v. to move in a particular direction by turning over and over or from side to side

synonym: spin, swirl, wheel

home.

(1) roll a ball, (2) roll down his cheeksHe was exhausted and rolled into bed as soon as he got

neurology

roll

n. the branch of medicine that deals with the diagnosis and treatment of disorders of the nervous system

synonym: brain science, nervous system, neuropathology

(1) cognitive **neurology**, (2) **neurology** department She is studying clinical **neurology** to become a brain surgeon.

lean

adj. having a noticeably small amount of body fat; (verb) to bend or move from a straight to a sloping posture

synonym: skinny, slender, (verb) slant

(1) a lean horse, (2) lean athletic figure

Lean operational improvements often lead to better environmental performance.

jostle

v. to push, elbow, or bump against someone or something in a forceful or crowded way; to compete with or struggle against another person or group for space, resources, or attention

synonym: push, bump, elbow

(1) **jostle** for position, (2) **jostle** my elbow

I had to **jostle** through the crowded concert to get to the front of the stage.

bully

 a person who uses strength or power to harm or intimidate those who are weaker; (verb) to intimidate, harass, or mistreat someone weaker or less powerful

synonym: tormentor, intimidator, aggressor

(1) bully bystander, (2) bully the weak

The schoolyard **bully** terrorized the other children and made their lives miserable.

dangle

v. to hang or swing loosely, especially in a way that suggests instability or lack of support; to tempt or tantalize by holding out the prospect of something desirable but uncertain

synonym: swing, hang, drape

(1) dangle a carrot, (2) dangle a pendant

The earring on her earlobe would **dangle** as she moved her head.

devise

v. to come up with an idea, plan, theory, etc., using your intelligence or imagination

synonym: create, concoct, invent

(1) devise a plan, (2) devise a literary plot

They had to **devise** a system that did not depend on fossil fuels.

splint

n. a rigid or flexible device used to immobilize or support a broken or injured bone or joint, often made of wood, metal, or other sturdy materials and commonly used in first aid or medical settings

synonym: brace, support

(1) splint bandage, (2) arm splint

After my skiing accident, I had to wear a leg **splint** for several weeks.

norm

- n. something that is regarded as usual, typical, or standard synonym: criterion, mean, standard
- (1) norm of action, (2) cultural norm

The systems we have developed has accepted as industry **norms**.

swallow

v. to make food, drink, pills, etc., pass down your throat into your stomach; (noun) small long-winged songbird noted for swift, graceful flight and the regularity of its migrations

synonym: consume, gulp, inhale

repetitively

(1) pat on the back, (2) pat a dog

She patted the puppy on the head and gave it a treat.

erase

v. to remove something completely, especially by rubbing it synonym: wipe out, delete, obliterate

pat

strive

(1) **erase** a memory, (2) **erased** the files He attempted to **erase** the misspelled word.

disastrous

adj. extremely bad, harmful, or unsuccessful synonym: catastrophic, destructive, fatal

(1) have **disastrous** consequences, (2) absolutely **disastrous** effect

The emission of hazardous substances has **disastrous** effects on the ecology of a region.

pursue

 to do something or attempt to attain something over time; to follow or seek someone or something, especially in trying to catch them

synonym: seek, hunt, chase

(1) **pursue** a goal, (2) **pursue** freedoms She intends to **pursue** a political career.

cellular

adj. of or connected with the cells of animals or plants; of or connected with a mobile telephone system that uses several short-range radio stations instead of wires

synonym: organic, biological, nuclear

(1) **cellular** and molecular biology, (2) a **cellular** phone handset

This factory employs a **cellular** manufacturing system.

blueprint

 a photographic print of an early plan for a building or machine

synonym: draft, prototype, sketch

(1) **blueprint** for economic reform, (2) architect's **blueprint** A business plan is a **blueprint** for your success.

able-bodied

 adj. having a healthy and strong body capable of physical activities; not suffering from physical disabilities that limit movement or strength

synonym: capable, fit, healthy

(1) able-bodied worker, (2) able-bodied athlete

The job posting required an **able-bodied** person for heavy lifting.

release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge
- (1) **release** a prisoner, (2) **release** CO2 into the air
 The animal rights group worked to **release** the dolphins back into the wild.

bias

 a strong feeling in favor of or against one group of people, an idea, or thing, often not based on fair judgment

synonym: inclination, partiality, predilection

(1) **bias** against a big company, (2) have a **bias** toward socialism

She researched gender bias in politics.

unfold

 to open up or spread out something that is folded or rolled up; to reveal or disclose something that was previously hidden or unknown

synonym: open, spread out, expose

unfold the story, (2) unfold the stroller
 The mystery unfolded as the detectives gathered more clues.

arch

 a curved structure with two supports that holds the weight of something above it, such as a bridge or the upper part of a building

synonym: turn, bow, arc

(1) the **arch** of a person's foot, (2) an **arch-shaped** stone structure

The **arch** bears the weight of the overhead bridge.

stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

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synonym: pierce, adhere, stay

(1) **stick** a key in a lock, (2) fire **stick**

You **stick** a bill in the change machine, and the coins pop out.

tongue

a moveable mass of muscle tissue covered with mucous membrane that is in the mouth; a language

synonym: lingo, language, vocabulary

(1) native **tongue**, (2) **tongue** cancer

The **tongue** is boneless, but it is as strong as bones.

torque

n. a twisting or rotational force that tends to cause rotation around an axis; a measure of the force that can cause an object to rotate;

synonym: twist, rotation, spin

(1) high torque, (2) torque settings

The mechanic used a **torque** wrench to tighten the bolts on the car engine.

belly

the front part of the body below the chest, containing the stomach and bowels; the rounded or curved part of an object, such as a ship or aircraft

synonym: stomach, abdomen, gut

- (1) the **belly** of the ship, (2) with an empty **belly** She had a tattoo just above her **belly** button.
- the top or extreme point of something slender or n. tapering, usually a mountain or hill; a piece of advice about something practical; a small amount of money given for services

toddler

- n. a young child who has recently learned to walksynonym: child, infant, youngster

screw

limber

mobility

 the ability to move or be moved freely or easily from one place, job, or social class to another

rejoice

v. to feel or express great joy or happiness; to celebrate or express gratitude for a happy or positive situation or event

yank

v. to pull something or someone forcefully with a sudden movement

batch

acknowledged
