There are numerous **misconceptions** about food and health.

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) **industrious** worker, (2) **industrious** student He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

#### insomnia

the condition of being unable to sleep, usually a chronic one

synonym: sleeplessness, wakefulness, restlessness

(1) medication for **insomnia**, (2) alcohol-dependent **insomnia** 

He suffered **insomnia** and loss of appetite after he began taking that medication.

## deplete

v. to reduce something, especially supplies of energy, money, etc., by a large amount; to use up resources or materials

synonym: exhaust, consume, use up

(1) **deplete** customer confidence, (2) **deplete** glycogen stores

If we continue to **deplete** the Earth's natural resources, we will cause severe damage to the environment.

## unspeakable

*adj.* too terrible, shocking, or distressing to speak about *synonym*: unspeakably horrible, indescribable, unutterable

(1) **unspeakable** crime, (2) **unspeakable** pain
The survivors of the plane crash could only describe the **unspeakable** horror of the experience.

#### ancestor

- n. a person from whom one is descended; a forefathersynonym: forebear, forefather, progenitor
- (1) ancestor language, (2) earliest human ancestor

My remote **ancestor** immigrated to the United States from Ireland in the 1800s.

#### sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

*synonym*: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

### nephew

- *n.* a son of your brother or sister
- three-year-old nephew,
   nieces and nephews
   mephew is eight months old and still being breastfed.

#### devastation

 the act of causing great destruction or damage, often on a large scale

synonym: destruction, ruin, havoc

(1) financial **devastation**, (2) **devastation** to life
The economic recession caused **devastation** in the housing market, with many people losing their homes.

## stigma

 a mark of shame or disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person

synonym: mark, blemish, disgrace

- n. difficulties or hardships that someone facessynonym: hardship, difficulty, trial

#### imbalance

 a situation in which two or more things are not equal or equally treated

synonym:

inequality, asymmetry, instability

(1) trade **imbalance**, (2) symptoms of hormonal **imbalance**An **imbalance** in certain substances causes problems with brain function.

### predisposition

- n. a tendency or inclination to a particular behavior or condition, often due to genetic or environmental factors
   synonym: tendency, inclination, disposition
- (1) **predisposition** to anxiety, (2) genetic **predisposition** Smoking can increase a person's **predisposition** to lung cancer.

#### stressor

- n. something that causes stress or emotional tensionsynonym: pressure, strain, burden
- (1) **stressor** event, (2) **stressor** management The deadline for the project was a major **stressor** for the team.

#### socioeconomic

- adj. relating to the social and economic factors that shape an individual, group, or community, particularly in terms of income, occupation, education, and social class
   synonym: social, economic, financial
- (1) **socioeconomic** status, (2) **socioeconomic** issues The **socioeconomic** conditions of a country can significantly affect its political stability.

## disparity

 a significant difference or inequality between two or more things

synonym: difference, inequality, gap

#### masculine
