to experience a dull, persistent pain or discomfort, typically of moderate or low intensity; to feel a continuous dull pain

synonym: hurt, throb, smart

(1) **ache** abominably, (2) **ache** all the time

I ache all over after running a marathon yesterday.

enrich

to make better or improve in quality by adding ν. something else

synonym: enhance, improve, augment

- (1) **enrich** a gas with a balloon, (2) **enrich** public services Reading not only increases knowledge but also **enriches** life.
- a slow-moving mollusk with a spiral shell that it uses to protect its body

synonym: escargot, slug, whelk

The gardener found a **snail** slowly making its way through the lettuce patch.

snail

neuron

a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body

synonym: nerve cell

nociceptor

recluse

- a person who lives in solitude and isolation synonym: hermit, solitary, loner

needless

adj. describing something unnecessary, pointless, or superfluous and could be avoided without any harm or adverse consequences

invertebrate

a class of animals that do not have a backbone; they include insects, worms, and mollusks

synonym: animal, mollusk, worm
