### prehistoric

#### mastodon

- a large, extinct elephant-like mammal that lived during the Pleistocene epoch, characterized by its long curved tusks and massive size

#### armadillo

#### amble

#### savannah

synonym: grassland, plain

#### uproot

#### graze

#### avocado

 a pear-shaped fruit with a hard skin and buttery flesh, commonly eaten raw in salads, sandwiches, or as guacamole

synonym: alligator pear, butter pear, midshipman's butter

avocado toast, (2) avocado smoothie
 love adding avocado to my salads for that extra creaminess.

flourish

- v. to grow or develop vigorously or successfully synonym: boom, advance, succeed
- flourish economically, (2) flourish worldwide
   The Ottoman Empire flourished for over five centuries.

#### hemisphere

- n. half of the terrestrial globe; half of a sphere
- northern hemisphere,
   cerebral hemisphere

#### oncoming

#### treetop

#### herbivore

#### reptile

 a cold-blooded animal that has dry, scaly skin and lays eggs on land, such as snakes, lizards, and turtles

synonym: lizard, serpent, snake

Alligators are a type of **reptile** that live in swamps and rivers.

#### algae

- A simple plant that grows in or near water and lacks typical leaves and roots

## camouflage
