### commander

a person who holds authority or control over a group or organization, particularly in a military, naval, or aerospace context; an official in charge of a particular aspect of operations, such as a commander of a ship or a commander of the air force

#### whisk

- v. to move something somewhere suddenly and quickly synonym: whip, hasten, wipe

### photograph

 a picture or image that is produced by a camera; a visual representation or record of a person, object, or scene that has been captured electronically or on film

*synonym*: photo, picture, snapshot

(1) **photograph** album, (2) **photograph** memories I found an old **photograph** of my grandparents from their wedding day.

### disguise

v. to hide or alter someone's appearance to deceive or mislead others

synonym: mask, misinterpret, cloak

(1) **disguise** my feelings, (2) **disguise** his voice Later it turned out that the politician **disguised** the fact from the public.

### journalist

 a person who collects and writes news stories or articles for newspapers, magazines, radio, television, or other online media

synonym: reporter, newsperson, press

(1) a China-based **journalist**, (2) **journalist** on a magazine Foreign TV crews and **journalists** can go as they please in various locations during the Olympics.

### negotiate

v. to have formal discussions with someone to reach an agreement

synonym: discuss, mediate, bargain

(1) **negotiate** a settlement, (2) **negotiate** the price of the house

We are always happy to negotiate a discount.

#### release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge
- (1) **release** a prisoner, (2) **release** CO2 into the air The animal rights group worked to **release** the dolphins back into the wild.

#### uniform

adj. always the same; showing a single form or character in all occurrences; (noun) the special set of clothes worn by members of a particular group as a means of identification

*synonym*: livery, outfit

(1) at a **uniform** temperature, (2) our school **uniform** This country has a nationally **uniform** culture.

### abuse

- n. the use of something in an incorrect or harmful mannersynonym: misuse, misconduct, vilification
- (1) the problem of drug **abuse**, (2) victim of sexual **abuse** Our company has an audit team that monitors directors for **abuse** of authority.

#### estimate

v. to guess or calculate the cost, size, value, etc. of something

synonym: calculate, gauge, evaluate

(1) **estimate** a fair value, (2) **estimate** this chicken to weigh three pounds

We **estimated** the season's total trade deficit at \$50 billion.

### epidemic

- the widespread outbreak of a particular disease in a large number of people at the same time
- synonym: outbreak, contagion, plague
- (1) a worldwide **epidemic**, (2) health **epidemic**The disease is now reaching **epidemic** proportions in our country.

#### caretaker

a person employed to take care of a large building such as a school and who deals with the cleaning, repairs, etc.; a person employed to look after a house or land while the owner is away

synonym: custodian, caregiver

welfare caretaker, (2) the role of caretaker
 He acted as a caretaker until a new president was elected.

### nephew

- n. a son of your brother or sister
- three-year-old nephew,
   nieces and nephews
   mephew is eight months old and still being breastfed.

den

 a wild animal's lair or hiding places, such as a fox or bear

synonym: lair, burrow, nest

(1) gambling den, (2) bear den

The fox had dug a **den** in the side of the hill, where it could rest and hide from predators.

obsess

 to fill the mind of someone continually so that one can't think of anything else

*synonym*: torment, beset, engross

(1) **obsess** over her weight, (2) he is **obsessed** with the fear

He's utterly **obsessed** with his promotion.

cigar

n. a roll of dried tobacco for smoking

synonym: cigarillo, cheroot, tobacco

(1) cigar smoking, (2) stub a cigar out

He lit a **cigar** and leaned back in his chair, savoring the taste and aroma.

dedicate

 to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

*synonym*: consecrate, devote, commit

(1) **dedicate** a few hours, (2) **dedicate** a chapter to the subject

He **dedicated** his life to helping others.

promote

v. to encourage or persuade people to like, buy, use, do, or support something; to raise someone to a higher position or rank

synonym: boost, raise, advertise

(1) promote a better relationship, (2) promote bad behavior

The government should do more to **promote** sustainable agribusiness.

### expose

v. to show something by uncovering it; to make something accessible to some action or influence

synonym: disclose, reveal, uncover

expose a crime, (2) expose a person to risks
 That newspaper exposed a political scandal in a big way.

#### violation

an action that breaches a law, rule, or agreement; an infringement of rights or duties

synonym: breach, transgression, infraction

(1) **violation** law, (2) commit a traffic **violation**The international community has widely condemned the **violation** of human rights.

### undeniable

*adj.* not possible to deny; true or certain *synonym*: absolute, definite, indubitable

(1) an **undeniable** fact, (2) an **undeniable** masterpiece Her influence on teenagers is **undeniable**.

### witness

a person who sees something happen, especially a crime or an accident

synonym: onlooker, attestant, bystander

witness of the car accident, (2) a material witness
 The manufacturing industry is witnessing fierce competition.

#### convict

v. to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison

synonym: condemn, sentence, judge

(1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

#### warlord

 a military leader who has gained control over a region or territory, typically through force or intimidation; a commander of an army or group of soldiers who operates outside the control of a legitimate government *synonym*: chieftain, commander, leader

The **warlord's** army was well-equipped and well-trained, making them a formidable force to reckon with.

 a facility where criminals are kept to be punished for their crimes; a prison

#### advocate

jail

 a person who supports or suggests an idea, development, or way of doing something

#### lawmaker

 a politician or legislator who is responsible for making and changing laws

#### convince

v. to persuade someone or make someone believe that something is true

*synonym*: persuade, win over, convert

### legislation

- a law or a set of laws suggested and then passed by a parliament, or the act of making or enacting laws

### fingertip

n. the end or tip of a finger

## eyewitness

### deny

 $\nu$ . to state that one refuses to admit the existence or truth of something

synonym: refute, reject, repudiate

(1) adamantly **deny** killing, (2) **deny** the allegations
He is still **denying** stealing the money from the cash register.

#### movement

n. a group of people working together to achieve a shared goal, especially a political, social, or artistic one; the

process of moving or being moved, physically or figuratively

synonym: motion, progression, action

(1) a circular **movement**, (2) **movement** of troops

The **movement** of the dancers on stage was graceful and elegant.

### protest

a strong expression of disagreement, disapproval, or opposition

synonym: objection, disapproval, challenge

(1) hold a **protest**, (2) a silent **protest** 

He left the party in **protest** at its radical political stance.

### president

n. the leader of a republic, for example, the US; the person in charge of the organization such as a company, university, club, etc.

synonym: leader, CEO, chairperson

president emeritus, (2) vice- president for finance
 The club president does not have absolute power.

#### undemocratic

adj. against to or not based on the principles of democracy synonym: totalitarian, authoritarian, autocratic

#### reform

 the act of improving or correcting something that is wrong or bad; a change made to correct a flaw or problem

synonym: change, modify, improve

#### circulate

v. to move continuously or freely around a place or closed system

synonym: flow, disperse, rotate

### government

 the group of people with authority to control a country or state

synonym: administration, regime, state

(1) **government** bureaucracy, (2) **government** funding The federal **government** is planning to increase taxes for the next fiscal year.

#### accuse

 to charge or criticize someone with a crime or wrongdoing

synonym: charge, blame, criticize

(1) **accuse** his rudeness, (2) **accuse** each other The witness **accused** the defendant of committing the robbery.

### independence

- n. freedom from another's or others' control or influencesynonym: freedom, liberty, autonomy
- (1) financial **independence**, (2) **independence** ceremony There is nothing more valuable than **independence** and freedom.

#### fake

adj. not genuine; fraudulent or counterfeitsynonym: affected, bogus, counterfeit

(1) fake police officer, (2) spread of fake news
The prime minister was not well prepared for the debate and faked it

#### metadata

 information that describes or provides contextual details about other data, such as the content, structure, format, or authorship of a document or file

synonym: data about data, descriptive information,

#### metainformation

(1) metadata analysis, (2) metadata storage

The **metadata** for a video game includes information about the game's platform and release date.

### strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

(1) military **strategy**, (2) develop a **strategy** 

Our plan includes a comprehensive marketing **strategy**.

### capture

v. to catch a person or an animal and confine them in an area which they cannot escape

synonym: catch, arrest, imprison

(1) **capture** a glimpse, (2) **capture** customers' hearts I was able to **capture** the moment on film.

### locate

v. to specify or determine the exact position of someone or something

synonym: discover, find, place

(1) **locate** a missing pet, (2) **locate** a tumor

The robot can accurately **locate** construction material.

### temperature

- n. the degree of hotness or coldness of a thing or placesynonym: climate, warmth, degree
- (1) extreme **temperatures**, (2) the atmospheric **temperature**

Cities around the world set records for highest **temperatures** this summer.

### verify

v. to check that something exists or is true, or to prove that something is correct

synonym: affirm, ascertain, confirm

(1) **verify** a document, (2) **verify** identity

We always verify all critical information independently.

valid

 adj. having a reasonable basis in logic or fact; still legally or officially acceptable

synonym: proper, reasonable, useful

(1) a **valid** contract, (2) a ticket **valid** for two days Your credit card is no longer **valid**.

retract

v. to take back, withdraw, or revoke something that has been said or done; to disavow or repudiate a statement or assertion that one has previously made

synonym: withdraw, take back, revoke

(1) retract a promise, (2) retract a lawsuit

I need to **retract** my statement because I realized it was incorrect.

proof

 a fact or piece of information that shows something is true or exists

synonym: testimony, evidence, assurance

(1) documentary **proof**, (2) a geometric **proof** 

Proof is better than argument.

platform

n. the raised flat space close to the track at a train station where passengers get on or off the train; (technology) a computational or digital environment in which a piece of software is executed

synonym: stage, podium, forum

(1) an arrival **platform**, (2) a digital **platform** for enterprise The speaker mounted the **platform** and started to speak.

develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) develop a strategy, (2) develop a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

### amazing

adj. extremely surprising, especially in a way that you like or admire

synonym: exceptional, extraordinary, wonderful

(1) **amazing** advances, (2) the most **amazing** feeling The golfer recorded an **amazing** distance.

#### android

a robot with a human appearance; (operating system)
 Google's mobile operating system

synonym: droid, cyborg

(1) household **android**, (2) **Android** tablet
The lab is developing an **android** robot that assists in dangerous construction work.

### deluge

 a severe flood; an overwhelming number or amount of something

synonym: flood, downpour, surge

(1) get caught in the **deluge**, (2) a **deluge** of fire Recent developments in data analysis techniques have been instrumental in finding insights from the data **deluge**.

### investigator

 a person whose job is to conduct an investigation or inquiry into something, often to gather information or evidence

synonym: inspector, sleuth, detective

private investigator, (2) clinical investigator
 The forensic investigator collected DNA samples from the crime scene to identify the perpetrator

### investigation

 the act or process of thoroughly examining a crime, problem, statement, etc., to uncover the truth

synonym: examination, analysis, inspection

(1) a preliminary **investigation**, (2) the scope of an **investigation** 

We have never before conducted a legitimate investigation.

#### broad

adj. very wide; general

synonym: wide, expansive, comprehensive

(1) attract broad attention, (2) a broad mindHe accumulated wealth across a broad spectrum of assets.

### daylight

- n. the natural light produced by the sun during the day, especially in contrast to artificial light or darknesssynonym: sunlight, daytime, day
- (1) daylight hours, (2) natural daylight

The view of the city skyline from the top of the building looked amazing in the **daylight**.

#### fabricate

v. to make something, especially by assembling parts or constructing it from raw materials; to invent and present something false as true or real to deceive someone

### defend

v. to protect someone or something from attack, criticism, danger, etc.

synonym: protect, guard, support

(1) **defend** my country, (2) **defend** against a threat International law allows each nation to **defend** itself when its rights and interests are illegally violated.

### courageous

adj. able to face and deal with danger or fear without flinching

synonym: brave, valiant, fearless

(1) make a **courageous** decision, (2) **courageous** rescue attempt

He was a **courageous** soldier who had served his country with honor.

#### resident

 a person who lives in a particular place or has their home in a place

synonym: dweller, inhabitant, inhabitant

(1) a **resident** of the city, (2) **resident** tax

Visa renewal for **resident** foreigners in this country is once every five years.

### frequent

adj. happening constantly

synonym: periodic, recurring, routine

(1) frequent absence, (2) frequent use

His heartaches are less **frequent** now.

### guidance

advice or instructions given to help direct someone's behavior or decision-making

synonym: advice, direction, support

(1) vocational guidance, (2) guidance counselor

The mentor provided **guidance** to the young entrepreneur, helping her navigate the business world.

tip

the top or extreme point of something slender or tapering, usually a mountain or hill; a piece of advice about something practical; a small amount of money given for services

synonym: edge, advice, gratuity

### upload

to transfer digital data or files from a local computer or device to a remote server or network: the act of transferring such data or files

synonym: transfer, load up

# inspiration

something that motivates or encourages someone to create or achieve something, or a feeling of excitement or creativity

synonym: motivation, drive, encouragement

(1) source of inspiration, (2) get inspiration from nature He found **inspiration** in the works of his favorite authors.

### ninja

 a Japanese warrior or assassin trained in martial arts and stealth tactics, associated with the feudal era of Japan

synonym: assassin, spy

(1) **ninja** costume, (2) **ninja** warrior

The skilled **ninja** moved stealthily through the shadows to carry out their mission.

### military

adj. relating to or characteristic of members of the armed forces; of or relating to war or warfare

synonym: armed, martial, warlike

(1) a military operation, (2) a military leader

The **military** academy was known for its strict discipline and training.

#### arrest

v. to take into custody

synonym: capture, detain, imprison

(1) arrest the thief, (2) arrest the progress

A police officer has the authority to arrest a criminal.

### livestream

n. a real-time video or audio broadcast of an event, performance, or activity that is encoded and distributed over the Internet, usually through dedicated apps or websites, allowing distributed viewers to watch it remotely

synonym: webcast, stream, broadcast

(1) livestream tutorial, (2) livestream concert

We watched the concert **livestream** since we couldn't attend in person.

#### distant

adj. far away in space, time, or where you are; far apart in relevance, relationship, or kinship

synonym: far, isolated, remote

(1) a distant memory, (2) distant ancestors

The sun set over the crest of **distant** hills.

tap

lever

v. to hit someone or something quickly, gently, and often repeatedly; to use existing resources, such as energy, knowledge, etc.

synonym: knock, exploit, use

- (1) **tap** a new market, (2) **tap** keyboard with an index finger To expand the company, we must **tap** new human resources.
- a handle used to operate a vehicle or a machine; a rigid bar resting on a pivot so that one end of it can be pushed or pulled easily

synonym: lifter, crowbar, bar

(1) a gear change lever, (2) lever for reformThis initiative will be a lever for increasing company sales.

solidarity

- n. unity or agreement of feelings or actions among a group, especially among individuals with a common interestsynonym: unity, cooperation, mutual support
- (1) **solidarity** among union members, (2) **solidarity** action The workers showed **solidarity** in their strike for better working conditions.

frontline

adj. in the most critical or dangerous position; in the military line or part of an army closest to the enemy

*synonym*: battlefront, cutting edge

(1) **frontline** health workers, (2) at the **frontline** of the war Within days, the new aircraft was in **frontline** service.

#### communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals;for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

**Communal** elections were held in several European countries.

mobilize

to make something ready for action or use; to organize people or resources for a particular purpose

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synonym: activate, rally, marshal

mobilize cooperation, (2) mobilize a stiff joint
 The military mobilized troops to the border.

#### assume

v. to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

(1) **assume** a lousy attitude to his boss, (2) **assume** an important role

The following example **assumes** that the capacity of each battery is the same.

#### individual

- n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a group synonym: person, being, self
- (1) a private **individual**, (2) **individual** freedom
  As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

### app

 n. (abbreviation for application) software designed to run on smartphones and other mobile devices or inside a web browser on a PC

synonym: application, software

(1) killer **app**, (2) cannot log in to the **app**The discovery of a critical bug caused the company to delay the **app's** release.

### perpetrator

a person who carries out a harmful or illegal act,
 particularly one that involves violence or deception

synonym: culprit, wrongdoer, offender

(1) **perpetrator** identity, (2) culprit **perpetrator** 

The police have not yet caught the **perpetrator** of the crime.

### immigration

 the act or process of coming to live permanently in a foreign country

synonym: migration, settlement, emigration

(1) **immigration** control, (2) **immigration** application The **immigration** policy in this country is stringent, making it difficult for many people to obtain a visa.

raid

a sudden short attack, usually by soldiers, ships, or aircraft

synonym: attack, invasion, aggression

(1) make a **raid** on an enemy's camp, (2) air- **raid** siren Throughout the **raid**, the bank robbers wore masks.

observer

 a person who watches or notices someone or something but has no active part in it

synonym: spectator, onlooker, watcher

(1) a shrewd **observer**, (2) an **observer** in the region According to the theory of relativity, time is different for each **observer**.

pilot

a person who flies an aircraft, especially as a job; a
person qualified to guide ships through a difficult area of
water

synonym: aviator, flyer, chief

a test pilot, (2) pilot production
 pilot exercised great care in landing.

favela

 a Brazilian shantytown or slum, typically located on the outskirts of a major city, characterized by poverty, overcrowding, and lack of basic services such as sanitation and security

synonym: shantytown, slum, ghetto

(1) **favela** neighborhood, (2) people in the **favelas**Many **favela** residents struggle to access basic amenities like running water and electricity.

translate

- v. to convert or change words into another language synonym: convert, transcribe, render
- (1) **translate** a document into English, (2) **translate** the emotion to a movement

#### distribute

to give something to a large number of individuals, or to spread or furnish something

synonym: broadcast, disperse, hand out

(1) distribute wealth evenly, (2) distribute video content His estate was **distributed** to his sons.

### amplify

- to enhance something, particularly sound or brightness synonym: intensify, boost, argument
- (1) **amplify** a signal, (2) **amplify** the effect You might need to **amplify** this point.

### forcibly

adv. done by physical power or violence; against someone's will

synonym: violently, roughly, aggressively

(1) **forcibly** remove, (2) **forcibly** taken into a car The police officer **forcibly** removed the protesters from the public park.

evict

to expel someone from a property, especially with the support of the law

synonym: oust, expel, eject

(1) evict a person from his home, (2) evict squatter The landlord may **evict** tenants for violations of the lease agreement.

### glossy

adj. having a smooth, shiny surface or finish; characterized by an attractive, polished appearance; often used to describe photographs or printed materials with a high-quality finish

synonym: shiny, polished, gleaming

(1) glossy lipstick, (2) glossy photograph

The magazine cover had a **glossy** finish, making the images shine.

wit

n. the ability to say or write things or ideas in a clever and humorous way

synonym: humor, comedy, funniness

(1) the wit of man, (2) full of wit

He has the **wit** to keep talking about this topic.

### bystander

 a person who witnesses an event or situation but does not actively participate or intervene

synonym: spectator, observer, witness

(1) innocent bystander, (2) shocked bystander

The **bystander** effect is a phenomenon where people are less likely to intervene in an emergency if others are present.

### transgender

adj. relating to or denoting a person whose gender identity does not correspond to that person's biological sex assigned at birth

*synonym*: non-binary

(1) **transgender** person, (2) **transgender** rights Many **transgender** individuals face discrimination and marginalization in society.

### vicious

adj. having or showing a desire to cause harm to others;having the nature of vice

synonym: malicious, spiteful, malevolent

(1) **vicious** attack, (2) **vicious** deflationary spiral
The **vicious** dog barked and growled at anyone who came near its territory.

### employee

- n. a person who is hired to work for a business or organization in exchange for wages or salary; a worker synonym: worker, staff, personnel
- (1) **employee** benefits, (2) **employee** evaluation
  The **employee** handbook outlines the rules and regulations that all employees must follow.

#### garner

to acquire or accumulate something through effort or attention

synonym: acquire, collect, obtain

(1) **garner** good reviews, (2) **garner** attention He used his charm and charisma to **garner** support for his campaign.

racist

adj. characterized by or showing discrimination or prejudice against people of other races; (noun) a person with a prejudiced belief that one racial group is superior to others

synonym: discriminatory, prejudiced, bigoted

(1) far-right **racist**, (2) **racist** attitudes

The **racist** comments made by the politician caused widespread condemnation.

### transphobia

 prejudice, discrimination, or hostility towards transgender people or people who do not conform to traditional gender roles or expectations

synonym: gender bias, gender bigotry

(1) overcome **transphobia**, (2) experience **transphobia**Discrimination and harassment against transgender individuals is a form of **transphobia** still prevalent in many parts of the world.

gender

n. the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

synonym: sexuality

(1) gender-blind policies, (2) dual genderCultural norms strongly influence gender expectations.

confirm




