eventually

decide

- v. to make up someone's mind about something; to come to a conclusion or judgment after considering options synonym: choose, determine, settle

graduate

 a person who has a first degree from university or college; (verb) to complete the first course of university or college and get a degree

psychology

- n. the scientific study of mind and behavior

chase

strike

suicide

despair

 the feeling that there is no hope and you cannot do anything to improve a difficult situation

comfort

renowned

adj. famous and respected for great achievements, qualities, etc.

synonym: noted, prominent, acclaimed

appropriate place

develop

obsess

individual

essential

synonym: caretaker, keeper, guardian

healing

 the process of becoming or making somebody or something well again

strength

n. the quality or state of being physically, or sometimes mentally, strong

synonym: resilience, power, muscles

contribute

v. to give something, especially money or goods, to provide or achieve something together with other people synonym: donate, devote, commit

worthwhile

clarity

n. the quality of being coherent and understandable; the quality of transparency or purity

edit

v. to prepare written material for publication by correcting, condensing, or otherwise modifying it

synonym: revise, modify, adjust

interpret

v. to explain or assign the meaning of information, actions, etc.

synonym: decode, decipher, analyze

(1) **interpret** a graph, (2) **interpret** the question

Different people might **interpret** this news differently.

retell

- v. to tell someone about something again or differently synonym: reiterate, repeat, restate
- (1) **retell** a story, (2) **retell** an old tale He **retells** the truth to plead not guilty.

constrain

v. to restrict or limit someone or something's freedom or ability to do something

synonym: restrict, limit, confine

(1) **constrain** his freedom, (2) **constrain** information flow The political situation **constrained** the country's economic growth and foreign relations.

paralyze

v. to cause a person or part of the body to become unable to move or feel

synonym: immobilize, disable, numb

(1) paralyze a city, (2) paralyze a person

The venom from the snake bite **paralyzed** his arm.

injury

 harm done to a person's or an animal's body caused by an accident or an attack

synonym: wound, damage, hurt

(1) without injury, (2) a fatal injury

weave

v. to make cloth, a carpet, a basket, etc., by repeatedly crossing a single thread through two sets of long threads at a right angle to them

synonym: braid, unite, contrive

purposeful

adj. having a specific aim or purpose; determined

synonym: determined, resolved, resolute

(1) purposeful series of actions, (2) at a purposeful pace

She had a **purposeful** look and was determined to complete the task.

mentor

 a person who helps and advises a younger or less experienced person over time, usually at work or school

synonym: adviser, coach, tutor

(1) mentor for life, (2) fashion mentor

As a **mentor**, he helped me realize my career.

redeem

v. to compensate for the faults or bad aspects of something; to regain possession or assume ownership of something by paying a sum of money or fulfilling a condition; to rescue or save someone from a difficult or hopeless situation

synonym: rescue, save, recover

(1) **redeem** a coupon, (2) **redeem** a government bond He tried to **redeem** himself by volunteering at the local charity after his mistakes.

redemption

 the act of saving or being saved from sin, error, or evil, or the process of regaining or earning something of value

synonym: rescue, salvation, liberation

(1) **redemption** of a loan, (2) a **redemption** bill He saw his time in prison as an opportunity for **redemption**.

therapy

 the act of caring for someone through medication, remedial training, etc.

synonym: antidote, medicine, treatment

(1) therapy for a patient, (2) field of gene therapyI underwent aversion therapy for my addiction to alcohol.

overnight

adj. lasting for or occurring during one night; occurring or changing extremely quickly or suddenly; happening or being achieved in a short amount of time

synonym: all-night, sudden, immediate

(1) overnight parking, (2) overnight success

The **overnight** package delivery arrived at my door this morning.

suffer

v. to experience pain, distress, or hardship; to undergo or endure something painful or unpleasant

synonym: endure, undergo, tolerate

(1) suffer a setback, (2) suffer bad grades

The older man **suffers** from arthritis and finds it difficult to move around.

embrace

v. to accept something willingly and enthusiastically; (noun) the act of clasping another person in the arms as in greeting or affection

synonym: grasp, hold tightly, accept

(1) **embrace** an opportunity, (2) a warm **embrace** The woods **embrace** the house.

insight

 the ability to gain an accurate and deep understanding of people or situations; an accurate and deep understanding of what something is like

synonym: wisdom, discernment, understanding

(1) a profound **insight**, (2) share my **insights**We gained various **insights** by analyzing the vast amount of

data owned by the company.

wisdom

- n. the quality of being wise, or the ability to use your knowledge and experience to make sensible decisionssynonym: sagacity, discernment, insight
- (1) a fountain of **wisdom**, (2) **wisdom** literature

 The community greatly respected and sought after the older adult's **wisdom**.

sustain

v. to supply enough of what somebody or something needs to survive or exist; to accept as valid

synonym: maintain, nurture, support

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(1) **sustain** a good relationship with him, (2) **sustain** a wellness lifestyle

She struggled to **sustain** the children's reading habits.

surround

- v. to be all around something or somebody synonym: encircle, encompass, envelop
- (1) **surround** a town, (2) a stone wall **surrounds** the palace On three sides, mountains **surround** the settlement.

spiritual

- adj. relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things
- synonym: otherworldly, ethereal, transcendental
- (1) constant **spiritual** striving, (2) **spiritual** leader

 The meditation class was focused on finding inner peace and cultivating a more **spiritual** connection with the universe.

associate

- v. to mentally connect someone or something with someone or something else
- synonym: tie in, link, consociate

whirl

dervish

- a Muslim ascetic who belongs to a Sufi order, known for their ecstatic dancing and other forms of physical and spiritual discipline
- synonym: Sufi dancer, mystic
- (1) whirling dervish, (2) the Sufi dervish

The sound of the **dervish's** tambourine and flute filled the air with a haunting melody.

poet

- n. a person who writes poetrysynonym: versifier, rhymer, writer

She is a talented **poet** who has been recognized for her work.

Sufi

n. a follower or practitioner of Islam's mystical or ascetic branch, known as Sufism. Sufis emphasize the personal experience of God and spiritual growth through contemplation, prayer, and devotion

synonym: mystic, dervish

The **Sufi** mystic preached a message of love and tolerance to his followers.

meditation

 the act of focusing one's mind on a particular object or thought; activity to train attention and achieve a mentally clear and emotionally calm and stable state

synonym: contemplation, reflection, introspection

(1) **meditation** training, (2) religious **meditation**The **meditation** instructor guided the group through the relaxation and breathing exercises.

involve

 to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

rein

n. a long, narrow strap attached to a horse's bit, used to control the animal while riding; a means of controlling or limiting something or someone's actions and behavior; (verb) to control or restrain something, especially something that is becoming excessive or out of control

synonym: strap, harness, headstall

(1) tight **rein**, (2) **rein** in costs

The new driver struggled to keep a firm grip on the **rein** as the horse bolted.

ego

- a consciousness of your own identity; a person's sense of self-esteem or self-importance, especially inflated one
 synonym: self-esteem, personality, psyche
- (1) **ego** defense mechanisms, (2) national **ego**She was constantly trying to boost her **ego** by talking about her accomplishments.

moor

- a large area of open country, typically on high ground, covered with rough grass or heath, especially in Britain

architecture

the art and science of designing and constructing buildings

synonym: design, structure, layout

presence

n. the fact or state that someone or something exists, occurs, or is present

synonym: existence, actuality, fact

principle

 a fundamental law or truth that explains or controls how something happens or works

synonym: rule, creed, code

(1) principle of treatment, (2) principle in business

Efficiency isn't an essential **principle** here; fairness is.

communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

Communal elections were held in several European countries.

cult

 a small religious group, especially one that is not part of a larger religion and that is regarded as outside the norm; followers of an exclusive system of beliefs and practices

synonym: sect, faith, religion

(1) **cult** members, (2) **cult's** practices

The **cult** leader promised his followers that they would achieve enlightenment if they followed his teachings.

alternative

- n. one of two or more available possibilities or choicesynonym: choice, option

institutionalize

v. to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

constantly

adv. all the time

synonym: continuously, always, frequently

sever

v. to break or separate something by cutting, especially suddenly and forcibly

synonym: cut apart, separate, detach

(1) **sever** a rope, (2) **sever** a positive relationship He **severed** a branch from a tree quickly.

graduated

adj. having received a degree from a school, college, or university; marked with or divided into levels or degrees

synonym: completed, finished, earned

(1) **graduated** taxation, (2) **graduated** flask

She was a **graduated** student of a prestigious university.

massive
