fury

pun

*n*. the quality of being worthy of esteem or respect; high office or rank or station

### develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

### technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

synonym: approach, procedure, strategy

- v. to win against somebody in a fight, war, or attempt synonym: conquer, beat, overpower

### planet

### shadow
