mythical

adj. based on or related to myths, legends, or folklore;existing only in tales or in the imagination

synonym: mythological, fictitious, legendary

slay

- v. to kill violently, especially with a weapon synonym: kill, murder, eliminate

Minotaur

 in Greek mythology, a creature with the head of a bull and the body of a man is depicted as inhabiting a labyrinth on the island of Crete

synonym: bull, labyrinth dweller

 a statement, situation, or person that has two opposite facts or features and therefore seems impossible, is difficult to understand, or is strange;

synonym: incongruity, dichotomy, contradiction

revolve

v. to rotate around a central point

synonym: rotate, spin, orbit

(1) **revolve** at high speed, (2) **revolve** around a central axis The Earth **revolves** around the Sun in an elliptical orbit.

undeniable
