- (1) blindfold game, (2) blindfold challenge The doctor administered a **blindfold** test to evaluate the patient's sense of touch.

rehearse

to practice or repeat something, such as a performance, speech, or action, to prepare for an event or to improve one's skills; to go through the motions of a planned activity before executing it

synonym: practice, recite, drill

synonym: epinephrine

baroque
