#### divulge

v. to reveal or make known something that was previously secret or confidential; to disclose information that was previously concealed or hidden

synonym: reveal, disclose, expose

#### overused

adj. used too often or too much, to the point of becoming cliched; lacking originality

synonym: overworked, overutilized, exhausted

(1) overused common, (2) overused cliché

The concept of time travel has become **overused** in science fiction and fantasy, with many movies and books exploring the idea.

#### cliche

 a phrase or expression that has become overused to the point that it has lost its original impact or meaning; a trite or unoriginal idea or statement

synonym: truism, platitude, stereotype

(1) cliche plot, (2) age-old cliche

Using the same **cliche** phrase in every conversation can take time and effort.



#### manipulative

 adj. characterized by the use of shrewd, cunning, or deceptive tactics to control or influence others, often in a self-serving or unethical manner

synonym: maneuvering, calculating, shrewd

(1) **manipulative** behavior, (2) **manipulative** language He was accused of being **manipulative** when he lied to his friends to get what he wanted.

#### terrify

- v. to frighten someone very much synonym: unnerve, scare, horrify
- (1) **terrify** people, (2) the threats **terrify** him It would be best not to **terrify** your associates into doing complex tasks.

#### synchronize

- v. to happen or cause to happen at the same time or rate synonym: coordinate, accompany, harmonize
- (1) **synchronize** movements, (2) **synchronize** our watches The ball speed will increase when the lower body movements are perfectly **synchronized**.

#### brainwave

 a sudden idea or inspiration; a moment of great insight or creativity

synonym: inspiration, brainstorm, revelation

(1) brainwave idea, (2) sudden brainwave

The engineer had a **brainwave** and redesigned the product to be more efficient.

### startling

adj. extremely surprising, astonishing, and sometimes worrying

synonym: alarming, astonishing, shocking

(1) **startling** earthquake shocks, (2) **startling** discovery He describes the story with **startling** reality.

#### interconnect

v. to connect similar things

synonym: interlink, complect, annex

(1) directly **interconnect** with those systems, (2) human

activities interconnect with the environment

Our system can now **interconnect** with other databases.

#### neuron

 a cell that is specialized to carry information within the brain and between the brain and other parts of the body

synonym: nerve cell

(1) excite the **neurons**, (2) **neuron** cell body

Our body transfers information along each **neuron** using an electrical impulse.

#### tangle

*n*. a confused mass of something twisted together

synonym: knot, snarl, entanglement

(1) in a tangle, (2) tangle wires

The cords behind my computer were a **tangled** mess.

#### recreate

v. to make something that existed previously happen or appear to exist again

synonym: renovate, vivify, revive

(1) **recreate** a single country, (2) **recreate** the feeling of the 1920s

She **recreated** the atmosphere of the pre-war age with her stage setting.

#### teleport

 to transport or transmit instantly from one location to another, typically using advanced technology or imagined supernatural powers

synonym: beam, transport, transmit

(1) **teleport** objects through space, (2) **teleport** to any location in the world

The magician seemed to **teleport** instantly from one side of the stage to the other.

ken

knowledge, perception, understanding, or range of sight;(verb) to be aware of or know

synonym: knowledge, understanding, familiarity

(1) within my ken, (2) ken of the person

He had a good **ken** of the city and could easily find his way around.

#### hardy

adj. able to withstand harsh conditions or difficult circumstances; robust, sturdy, or resilient

synonym: tough, sturdy, resilient

(1) hardy plants, (2) hardy breed

The **hardy** construction workers worked tirelessly in the scorching heat to complete the project.

#### stereotype

- a fixed and unvarying idea or image that people have about what someone or something is like, but which is often not true in reality and may cause hurt and offense
- avoid stereotype,
   negative stereotypes
   changing stereotypes about LGBTQ requires considerable effort.

#### teem

- v. to be abuzz; to move in large numbers; to fall heavily synonym: brim, swarm, overflow
- (1) **teem** with activity, (2) **teem** down The city **teems** with traffic on holiday.

#### worldview

 a particular philosophy or cognitive orientation of life or conception of the world

synonym: perspective, position, viewpoint

(1) mainstream **worldview**, (2) the **worldview** of the ancient civilization

The war between the two countries was also a battle between competing **worldviews**.

#### kitten

n. a young cat

synonym: catling, kitling, puss

(1) kitten formula, (2) newborn kitten

The **kitten's** fur was so fluffy that it looked like it was always moving.

#### leopard

- a large wild cat that has yellow-brown fur with black spots and lives in Africa and southern Asia
- (1) snow leopard, (2) leopard print

**Leopards** lurked in the grass to catch their prey.

#### oppress

to treat people in a cruel and authoritarian way, especially by denying them the same freedoms, rights, etc. as other people

synonym: antagonize, distress, burden

(1) **oppress** the minority, (2) **oppress** the people with force Historically, many countries have often **oppressed** certain religions to gain the support of the majority of the population.

#### brainwash

to indoctrinate someone into a belief system or ideology by means of sustained persuasion or propaganda

synonym: indoctrinate, manipulate

(1) **brainwash** consumers into buying, (2) **brainwash** young people into joining

The cult leader tried to **brainwash** his followers into believing he was a god.

#### provocative

adj. arousing anger, interest, or another strong reaction, especially deliberately

synonym: instigating, provoking, inciting

*synonym*: revolution, RPM, speed
