outlast

synonym: endure, survive, persevere

Armageddon

 a biblical term referring to a final battle or struggle, often associated with cataclysmic events or the end of the world; a great, decisive conflict or confrontation

synonym: doomsday, apocalypse, destruction

instantaneous

incessant

fluent

adj. able to communicate in a specific language smoothly or effectively, or easily

synonym: eloquent, articulate, smooth-spoken

confer

v. to have a meeting or discussion to come to a decision or agreement or exchange ideas; to bestow something

synonym: consult, meet, discuss

(1) confer degree, (2) confer honor

The leaders of the two countries met to **confer** on the issue.

paraphrase

v. to restate or reword a passage in one's own words, often to clarify or simplify the original meaning

synonym: rephrase, reword, reinterpret

(1) **paraphrase** a poem into prose, (2) **paraphrase** the meaning

He **paraphrased** the article in his own words to avoid being accused of plagiarism.

stylistic

adj. relating to or concerned with style, especially literary or artistic style

synonym: aesthetic, artistic

(1) a rhetorically **stylistic** manner, (2) **stylistic** features His cultural background influenced the **stylistic** choices of the artist.

acronym

 a word formed from the first letter of each word in a phrase, such as NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) or AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)

synonym: abbreviation, initialism, shortcut

aplomb

 self-confidence or assurance, especially in difficult or challenging situations; poise or composure in handling a situation with calmness and confidence

synonym: poise, composure, self-assurance

curveball
