platform

improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

reduction

- n. a decrease in size, amount, or degree synonym: diminution, decrease, cutback

attractive

 adj. immensely appealing in look or sound; having characteristics or qualities that make something appealing and valuable

export
