jihad

n. a concept in Islam referring to a struggle or effort, often internal, to uphold or defend the faith, which can be interpreted in different ways, including as a spiritual or political struggle

desire

- n. a strong feeling of wanting to have or do somethingsynonym: ambition, appetite, greed

relief

 a feeling of happiness and relaxation that comes when something burdensome is removed or reduced

noble

 adj. having or showing excellent personal qualities or high moral principles that people admire

synonym: dignified, aristocratic, benevolent

chivalrous

adj. characterized by qualities associated with knights, such as honor, courtesy, bravery, and a commitment to serving and protecting others, especially women

synonym: gallant, courteous, knightly

He was always **chivalrous** towards women, opening doors and carrying their bags.

claim

to assert that something is true; to demand or request something as one's own; to lay legal or moral right to something; (noun) a demand or assertion of a right or something that one believes to be true

horrific

adj. causing horror or disgust; gruesome and terrifying synonym: terrifying, alarming, shocking

brutality

exertion

spiritual

adj. relating to or affecting the human spirit or soul as opposed to material or physical things

purification

n. the process of removing impurities, contaminants, or pollutants from something, often through a chemical or physical process; the act of cleansing or purging morally or spiritually

devotion

 great loyalty and love or deep consideration for someone or something

transformation

 a complete change in form, nature, or appearance of someone or something

synonym: change, conversion, renewal

wisdom

- n. the quality of being wise, or the ability to use your knowledge and experience to make sensible decisionssynonym: sagacity, discernment, insight

remembrance

cancel

 to decide that a previously scheduled activity will not take place

synonym: abort, invalidate, annul

forgiveness

- *n.* the act of stopping feeling angry or resentful towards someone for a mistake or offense with compassion
- synonym: pardon, amnesty, compassion

benevolence

pervert

struggle

fascist

destitute

 adj. lacking basic material necessities such as food, shelter, and clothing; impoverished

relative

adj. considered and evaluated through comparison with something else

corps

 a large group of people trained and organized for a particular purpose, such as the military or a performing arts troupe

synonym: body, group, organization

starvation

 a severe lack of food that leads to malnutrition and, ultimately, death

synonym: hunger, malnutrition, emaciation

wanton

adj. causing harm or damage deliberately and showing no care at all; casual and unrestrained in sexual behaviorsynonym: lustful, extravagant, lewd

fascinate

v. to attract and hold the attention of someone deeply and irresistibly

homeschooling

 the practice of educating children at home rather than sending them to a school outside the home, typically done by parents or guardians

synonym: home education, homeschool instruction, unschooling

Due to the pandemic, many parents have turned to **homeschooling** to ensure their child's education.

release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge

atrocity

reward

pioneer

perversion

n. the distortion or corruption of something, typically a natural or normal phenomenon or behavior, into something abnormal, unnatural, or immoral; a sexual behavior or interest that deviates from societal norms or expectations

synonym: deviation, distortion, corruption

lust

- n. a strong desire or craving, usually of a sexual nature synonym: desire, passion, craving

perpetuate

- v. to make something continue or prevail for a long time synonym: eternalize, preserve, maintain

caliphate

- an Islamic state under the leadership of an Islamic steward with the title of caliph
- (1) the medieval Caliphate, (2) Caliphate lasted for four

grateful

adj. feeling or showing an appreciation of kindness; thankful synonym: thankful, appreciative, indebted

(1) a **grateful** breeze, (2) put a **grateful** expression She was **grateful** for the help he provided.

bore

to make someone feel weary or uninterested, often by talking at length about uninteresting or mundane topics; to cause someone to feel bored or unengaged; (noun) a hole or tunnel drilled or dug into the ground, either for exploration or extraction of natural resources

synonym: bear, tire, weary

(1) **bore** diameter, (2) **bore** him with his stories

The lecture on quantum physics **bored** me to tears.

hostility

- n. aggressive or unfriendly feelings or behaviorsynonym: antagonism, antipathy, estrangement
- an act of hostility, (2) bitter hostility

enmity

 the state or feeling of being actively opposed or hostile to someone or something

synonym: hostility, antipathy, animosity

Muslim

n. a follower of the religion of Islam

bond

 a close emotional connection between two or more people; a certificate of debt that a government or corporation issues to raise money synonym: bind, adhesion, attachment

innocent

adj. not guilty of a crime, offense, etc.; not having an evil mind or knowledge

synonym: blameless, honest, harmless

(1) an **innocent** child, (2) thousands of **innocent** people

lovable

adj. deserving or inspiring love and affection

synonym: adorable, charming, dear

(1) **lovable** personality, (2) a **lovable** creature

The little puppy was **lovable** and had a playful personality.

eager

adj. showing enthusiasm and a strong desire or interest to do something

synonym: keen, enthusiastic, ardent

(1) eager anticipation, (2) with eager eyes

The children were **eager** to start the treasure hunt.

cruel

adj. feeling or showing pleasure in causing pain or suffering to others

synonym: heartless, sadistic, vicious

(1) a **cruel** and unusual punishment, (2) **cruel** joke

The dictator was known for his **cruel** and oppressive regime.

thrust

v. to push or drive forcibly; to impose or insert; (noun) the force used in pushing

synonym: push, shove, prod

explode

v. to burst or break open violently and noisily; to cause something to burst or break open

synonym: detonate, blast, rupture

mortar

 a mixture of cement, sand, and water used for binding building materials together; a heavy, deep bowl used to pound or grind substances

The bricklayer started on the second course of bricks, laying them in fresh **mortar**.

shell

 hard outer covering or case of eggs, nuts, some seeds, and some animals

synonym: ammunition, armor, cover

The outermost electron **shell** determines the chemical properties of an atom.

trench

 a long, deep ditch made in the ground, usually parallel to a plate boundary and marking a subduction zone; a long ditch built in the ground for carrying away water

synonym: aqueduct, ditch, channel

A trench was being dug alongside the road by workers.

deposit

n. a sum of money or materials placed or kept in a bank, safety deposit box, or other secure places for safekeeping; a layer of rock, sand, or other material left behind by a flowing liquid or eroding force

makeshift

lab

 a workplace for the conduct of scientific research; a laboratory

pointless

adj. having no purpose or reason; serving no useful function; meaningless or senseless

skirmish

 a minor or brief battle or fight, often between small groups or individuals; a dispute, conflict, or argument, usually of short duration

discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

recover

- v. to return to a former condition, health, mind, or strength synonym: come back, convalesce, heal

device

 a piece of equipment, tool, or technology that serves a particular purpose or function, often mechanical or electronic

synonym: gadget, instrument, tool

harmless

adj. not able or not likely to cause damage or harm synonym: benign, innocuous, inoffensive

jungle

 an area of tropical forest where in which trees and plants grow very thickly

synonym: wilderness, forest

grenade

 a hand-held explosive device designed to be thrown or projected toward a target and detonate upon impact or after a specified time
