#### disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

#### industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

#### inertia

 the quality or state of being inactive, sluggish, or slow to move or act

synonym: sluggishness, lethargy, idleness

(1) **inertia** resistance, (2) Newton's law of **inertia**The object's **inertia** kept it moving in a straight line until acted upon by an outside force.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

#### trajectory

the curved path followed by an object moving through space

synonym: course, curve, orbit

(1) career trajectory, (2) a trajectory missile

#### austerity
