backyard

seal

nerd

crazy

adj. stupid or not sensible; very angry

adj. distant in time or space; remote; distant or unlikely to happen

synonym: distant, remote, faraway

indoor

adj. located, happened, or used inside a building

(1) an **indoor** pool, (2) designed for **indoor** use

Table tennis is an **indoor** sport.

#### fabric

 cloth or other material produced by weaving wool, cotton, silk, etc., used for making clothes, covering furniture, etc.

synonym: cloth, material, goods

(1) a hand-loomed **fabric**, (2) **fabric** of creation

These synthetic **fabrics** are used in military vests because of their excellent abrasion resistance.

### democracy

n. a form of government in which the people have the authority to deliberate and decide legislation, or to choose governing officials to do so

### playbook

### strategy

### deploy

v. to move troops or weapons into a position or military action; to bring into something in an effective way

#### mission-critical

adj. essential to the success or functioning of a particular mission, task, or operation, often with significant

#### massive
