synonym: confined, restricted

bully

 a person who uses strength or power to harm or intimidate those who are weaker; (verb) to intimidate, harass, or mistreat someone weaker or less powerful

synonym: tormentor, intimidator, aggressor

(1) bully bystander, (2) bully the weak

The schoolyard **bully** terrorized the other children and made their lives miserable.

addict

 a person who cannot stop using or doing something as a habit, especially something harmful

synonym: devotee, buff, freak

(1) a drug addict, (2) Internet addict

We have become TV **addicts** due to video streaming services.

horrific

adj. causing horror or disgust; gruesome and terrifyingsynonym: terrifying, alarming, shocking

(1) horrific experience, (2) horrific condition

The accident scene was **horrific**, with bodies and debris scattered everywhere.

triage

n. the process of sorting or categorizing patients or other items by severity or priority to determine the order in which they should be treated or handled

synonym: sorting, prioritizing, categorizing

(1) **triage** system, (2) **triage** nurse

In the aftermath of the hurricane, the military set up a **triage** center to assist with medical emergencies.

bulimia

n. an eating disorder characterized by repeated episodes of binge eating, followed by behaviors such as purging or fasting, often as a means of controlling weight or anxiety synonym: binge-eating disorder, ednos, overeating

(1) **bulimia** treatment, (2) **bulimia** nervosa

She struggled with **bulimia** for years before seeking treatment.

hyperventilation

n. a condition in which a person breathes very quickly and deeply, causing an increase in oxygen and a decrease in carbon dioxide levels in the blood, which can lead to symptoms such as dizziness, tingling, and fainting

synonym: over-breathing, rapid breathing

(1) **hyperventilation** syndrome, (2) **hyperventilation** treatment

Anxiety is a common cause of **hyperventilation**, as the body responds to perceived threats with rapid, shallow breathing.

bipolar

- adj. of, relating to, or occurring in both polar regions; of or relating to manic depressive illness
- (1) **bipolar** depression, (2) a **bipolar** semiconductor The physician prescribed medication to treat **bipolar** disorder.

numb

- adj. unable to feel physical sensation and movement; not showing human feeling or sensitivity
- synonym: dazed, insensitive, emotionless
- numb with cold, (2) a numb mind
 My left arm became numb.

robin

 a small bird from the thrush family, typically having a red breast and found across Europe, Asia, and North America

synonym: thrush, red-breast, redbird

(1) robin eggs, (2) robin's nest

I love listening to the cheerful song of the **robin** in my garden.

hotline

- a telephone line that provides immediate emergency or special assistance
- synonym: helpline, emergency line, crisis line

(1) hotline number, (2) automated hotline

The emergency **hotline** is available 24/7 for people in need of immediate assistance.

ideate

 to conceive of and develop an idea or concept in one's mind, often as part of a creative process or a problem-solving effort

synonym: conceive, think up, brainstorm

(1) ideate solutions, (2) ideate process

The team met to **ideate** new marketing strategies for the upcoming product launch.

excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

nerd

 a person who is very interested in and knowledgeable about a particular subject such as computers, mathematics, chess, etc.

synonym: geek, techie, wonk

(1) a computer **nerd**, (2) **nerd** neck He was, by nature, a cyber **nerd**.

swipe

 to strike, hit, or slap with a sweeping motion; to pass a magnetic stripe or barcode through a scanner to read data; to steal or take something quickly and with little effort

synonym: flick, brush, pinch

(1) **swipe** a card, (2) **swipe** left on a dating app

He tried to **swipe** the phone from my hand, but I held on tight.
