chrysalis

n. the pupa or the hardened protective case that encloses and shelters a transforming insect, such as a butterfly or moth, during its metamorphosis from larva to adult

synonym: cocoon, pupa, metamorphosis

stifle

The oppressive regime tried to **stifle** free speech and dissent.

muted

adj. having a subdued or softened sound, color, or tone; restrained or understated in expression or style

synonym: dull, hushed, muffled

(1) muted light, (2) muted sound

The toned-down, **muted** colors in the living room gave it a cozy and relaxed feeling.

powerless

adj. lacking power, strength, or authority; unable to act or affect change

synonym: helpless, impotent, feeble

(1) **powerless** position, (2) **powerless** in the organization During the hurricane, we felt **powerless** against the winds and rain.

rerun

synonym: repeat, replay, re-airing

I missed the episode of my favorite show, so I hope they will air a **rerun** soon.

jolly

adj. happy and lively

synonym: cheerful, happy, merry

(1) a **jolly** laugh, (2) **jolly** evening He was in a **jolly** mood and sang a happy tune.

devoid

adj. completely lacking or free from something synonym: empty, lacking, void

devoid of life, (2) air devoid of pollution
 The room was devoid of any furniture or decorations.

disbelief

 the feeling of not being able to believe or accept that something is true or real

synonym: doubt, mistrust, incredulity

(1) **disbelief** in the authority, (2) ask in **disbelief** His reaction was one of complete **disbelief**.

confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

worthless

adj. having no value or usefulness; not worth consideringsynonym: valueless, useless, pointless

(1) worthless stock, (2) worthless coin

The product was found to be **worthless** as it failed to meet the customer's expectations.

caretaker

 a person employed to take care of a large building such as a school and who deals with the cleaning, repairs, etc.; a person employed to look after a house or land while the owner is away

synonym: custodian, caregiver

He acted as a caretaker until a new president was elected.

grieve

v. to feel or show great sadness or sorrow, especially for someone who has died

synonym: mourn, lament, sorrow

abyss

resigned

synonym: submissive, acquiescent, passive

comprehend

reshape
