swipe

 to strike, hit, or slap with a sweeping motion; to pass a magnetic stripe or barcode through a scanner to read data; to steal or take something quickly and with little effort

synonym: flick, brush, pinch

hysterical

adj. marked by or in a state of excessive or uncontrollable emotion

synonym: agitated, frantic, crazy

dichotomy

a division or contrast between two things that are or are represented as being opposed or entirely different; a sharp contrast between two opposing and mutually exclusive categories or concepts

synonym: division, duality, contrast

crappy

adj. of poor quality; not satisfactory synonym: poor, unsatisfactory, inferior

ancestor

cognition

campfire

symphony

hunch

proprioception
