machete

 a large, heavy knife with a broad blade used for cutting vegetation or, in some cultures, as a weapon

synonym: panga, chopper, sword

The farmer used a steel **machete** to clear away the dense underbrush in the field.

smuggle

jot

rectangle

 synonym: oblong, square, quadrangle

The living room had a **rectangle-shaped** coffee table in the center of it.

acronym

 a word formed from the first letter of each word in a phrase, such as NASA (National Aeronautics and Space Administration) or AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)

synonym: abbreviation, initialism, shortcut

peacekeeping
