synonym: outdistance, outstrip, overtake

(1) **outpace** market share, (2) **outpace** economic growth Her running speed allowed her to **outpace** her competitors and win the race.

#### astronomer

n. a physicist who studies astronomy

synonym: stargazer, cosmologist, astrophysicist

(1) amateur **astronomer**, (2) solar **astronomer**This question has fascinated solar **astronomers** for decades.

#### rover

 a vehicle designed to travel over rough terrain, especially on the surface of a planet or moon

synonym: vehicle, robot, explorer

(1) rover mission, (2) lunar rover

The **rover** on Mars is gathering data on the planet's surface and sending it back to Earth.

#### **Martian**

adj. of or relating to Mars or its imaginary inhabitants

(1) Martian geography, (2) Martian surface

There is very little water in the **Martian** atmosphere.

## spaceflight

n. the act of traveling into space, either by means of crewed or uncrewed spacecraft; the technology and infrastructure required to support space travel

synonym: space travel, orbital flight

**Spaceflight** technology has advanced significantly since the first man landed on the moon in 1969.

#### tantalize

v. to tease or torment by presenting something desirable but out of reach or unattainable; to tempt or lure with the promise of something desirable

synonym: tease, tempt, torment

The smell of freshly baked cookies in the kitchen **tantalized** me.

#### exhale

v. to breathe out air or vapor from the lungs or mouth; to release or emit something slowly or gently

*synonym*: breathe out, expel, emit

(1) **exhale** a big sigh, (2) **exhale** cigarette smoke He took a deep breath and slowly began to **exhale**.

#### rainforest

- a forest rich in biodiversity that is generally found in tropical settings with heavy annual rainfall
- (1) **rainforest** destruction, (2) tropical **rainforest**The destruction of the **rainforest** is a ticking time bomb for the Earth.

#### inflict

v. to cause harm, injury, or suffering to someone or something

synonym: impose, levy, administer

inflict a heavier tax, (2) inflict a hard blow
 the storm inflicted significant damage on the town.

## interplanetary

- adj. relating to or occurring between planets, particularly regarding space travel or communicationsynonym: interstellar, planetary, celestial
- (1) **interplanetary** debris, (2) **interplanetary** exploration Scientists are working on developing **interplanetary** travel to explore other planets in our solar system.

#### titanic

 adj. of or having a great size, power, or influence; of or relating to Titanium (= a light, strong grey, lustrous, corrosion-resistant metallic element)

synonym: colossal, massive, immense

#### lifeboat

 a small boat designed to be launched from a larger vessel in case of an emergency, typically used to rescue passengers or crew members in danger of drowning synonym: rescue boat, safety boat, emergency vessel

#### **hubris**
