synonym: hindrance, obstacle, impediment

#### solvable

#### opportune

#### timestamp

- a record in printed or digital form that shows when a specific event happened, usually giving the date and time of day

#### escrow

 a financial arrangement in which a third party holds money or property on behalf of two other parties until a particular condition is met

synonym: deposit, stake, bond
