The product developed through years of research continues to **electrify** the market.

### hydropower

 electricity generated from the energy of moving water, usually using turbines and dams in rivers or other bodies

#### of water

*synonym*: hydroelectricity, waterpower, hydro

(1) **hydropower** plant, (2) **hydropower** energy

Many countries around the world have built dams to harness the power of **hydropower** for their energy needs.

#### geothermal

adj. relating to or produced by the internal heat of the earth; often used to refer to energy produced by tapping into the natural heat of the earth

synonym: underground, thermal, subterranean

(1) geothermal activity, (2) geothermal drilling

The town is exploring using **geothermal** energy to power its homes and buildings.

### paradox

 a statement, situation, or person that has two opposite facts or features and therefore seems impossible, is difficult to understand, or is strange;

synonym: incongruity, dichotomy, contradiction

(1) French **paradox**, (2) the **paradox** of the heap There are many theories to explain this **paradox**.

#### decarbonize

 to stop or reduce emitting carbon gases, especially carbon dioxide, by replacing energy made from fossil fuels with renewable energy

synonym: decoke, decarburise, decarburize

- (1) **decarbonize** their manufacturing process,
- (2) decarbonize its energy system

We have to seek methods to **decarbonize** its fossil fuel economy.

#### abolish

- v. to do away with completely; to put an end to synonym: cancel, repeal, annul
- abolish slavery, (2) abolish censorship
   The government voted to abolish the outdated law.

#### smashing

 adj. very successful or impressive; causing something to be broken or destroyed

synonym: great, wonderful, breaking

(1) a **smashing** blow, (2) give **smashing** results

The band's new album was a **smashing** success, reaching the top of the charts.

#### deforest

to clear an area of forest or trees

synonym: clear-cut, strip, denude

(1) **deforest** a mountain, (2) **deforest** millions of acres The company planned to **deforest** a large rainforest area to make way for a new plantation.

#### ecotourism

 a form of tourism that involves responsible travel to natural areas while promoting conservation and local community development

synonym: sustainable tourism, green tourism

(1) **ecotourism** activities, (2) sustainable **ecotourism**The **ecotourism** industry strongly focuses on preserving natural habitats and protecting endangered species.

quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

(1) a hard and **resilient** steel, (2) **resilient** population She is a **resilient** person and has always bounced back from setbacks.

capita

 a Latin word meaning "head," used to express the amount for each person; any head or headlike expansion on a structure, as on a bone synonym: head, headcount, person

(1) per **capita** sales, (2) the agricultural yield per **capita** GDP per **capita** shrunk by almost 10 percent for the third consecutive year.

#### empower

- v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle
- (1) **empower** my life, (2) **empower** the secretary to do the same

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

#### volcano

 a mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapor, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust.

synonym: mount, peak, crater

(1) volcano alert level, (2) active volcano

The island was formed by a volcano millions of years ago.

### disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

explode

v. to burst or break open violently and noisily; to cause something to burst or break open

synonym: detonate, blast, rupture

(1) **explode** in anger, (2) **explode** in popularity The old building **exploded** in a fiery inferno.

### imprison

v. to confine a person to a prison, a detention facility, or a place of involuntary confinement

*synonym*: incarcerate, detain, confine

(1) **imprison** illegal immigrant, (2) **imprison** myself within the room

He was **imprisoned** for embezzlement.

### utopia

 an ideal and perfect society in which all social and political problems have been solved, and all members live in harmony and prosperity

synonym: paradise, heaven, Arcadia

(1) perfect **utopia**, (2) a **utopia** for an engineer The concept of **utopia** is often viewed as an impossible or unrealistic goal, as it goes beyond what is currently possible.

#### urbanization

 the process of population growth and physical expansion of cities, often involving increased migration from rural areas and the development of urban infrastructure and culture

synonym: urban development, urban growth, urban expansion

#### redefine

### dignify

#### unbearable

 adj. not able to be tolerated or endured; too difficult, severe, or intense to be dealt with or suffered through; intolerable or insufferable

synonym: intolerable, insufferable, unendurable

(1) unbearable heat, (2) unbearable pain

The loss of his wife was an **unbearable** sorrow that he found hard to overcome.

#### crave

v. to have a strong desire for something; to long for or want intensely

synonym: desire, yearn, long for

(1) **crave** chocolate, (2) **crave** advice from others
She **craves** success and is always pushing herself to do better.

### boggy

adj. containing a lot of soft, wet soil; marshy, swampy, or waterlogged

*synonym*: swampy, marshy, mucky

(1) boggy land, (2) boggy area

The trail through the forest was so **boggy** that our shoes became soaked.

#### avalanche

 a sudden and rapid movement of a large amount of snow, ice, rocks, or other debris down a steep slope; a rapid and overwhelming occurrence of events or circumstances

synonym: snowslide, snowfall, downfall

The skiers narrowly escaped the **avalanche** by taking shelter behind a nearby rock.

#### powerless

adj. lacking power, strength, or authority; unable to act or affect change

synonym: helpless, impotent, feeble

#### politic

adj. wise and displaying the ability to make reasonable decisions

synonym: wise, tactful, expedient

(1) a **politic** decision, (2) heal the body **politic** She was **politic** in her behavior.

#### abolition

 the act of formally ending a system, practice, or institution, especially one that is considered unjust or harmful

synonym: termination, discontinuation, end

(1) complete **abolition**, (2) total **abolition** of a law The **abolition** of slavery was a major milestone in the history of the United States.

#### barrack

to provide accommodations or housing, often for military personnel or sports teams; to spur on or encourage especially by cheers and shouts; (noun) a large building or group of buildings that provide temporary housing for soldiers or other military personnel

synonym: house, lodge, cheer
