# journalist

# digital

# background

# occupy

- v. to consume all of someone's space, attention, or time synonym: inhabit, settle, populate

# occupation

a person's job or profession; the act of taking possession

# segregate

racial

# boycott

# mimeograph

 a duplicating machine used primarily in the past to make copies of written or printed material, which involves the transfer of ink from a stencil onto paper

synonym: duplicator, copy machine

(1) mimeograph ink, (2) mimeograph paper

The church secretary used a **mimeograph** machine to print the weekly church bulletin.

#### leaflet

 a small, thin piece of paper or other material, often used for advertising or informational purposes; a small branch or part of a leaf

synonym: pamphlet, brochure, flier

The environmental group handed out **leaflets** to raise awareness of the dangers of deforestation.

# sneaking

# daunting

 adj. looking challenging to manage in prospect; making someone anxious and less confident about carrying out something

synonym: intimidating, stunning, disheartening

(1) face the **daunting** reality, (2) seem like a **daunting** task My homework was **daunting** and complex, but it was also intriguing.

# carpool

 a group of people who regularly travel together in one vehicle, typically to commute to work or school

synonym: ride-share, car-sharing, lift-share

(1) **carpool** lane, (2) **carpool** program I'm looking for a **carpool** buddy to share the drive to the conference.

#### database

- n. a large amount of data stored in a computer system in such a way that it can be searched and updated easily
- (1) **database** administrator, (2) employee **database**Each country's officials can access the central **database**.

#### coordinate

v. to bring the different parts of the activity and the people into an organized, ordered, or efficient relationship; (adjective) of equal importance, rank, or degree

synonym: organize, harmonize, ordinate

#### minefield

# inequality

 the unfairness of a society in which some people have more opportunity, money, etc. than others; (mathematics) relation between two values when they are different

synonym: imbalance, prejudice, unfairness

(1) **inequality** in salary, (2) algebraic **inequality**There are several causes of economic **inequality** within societies.

#### fuel

a substance that is typically burned to generate heat or energy

synonym: energy, power, gas

(1) biomass fuel, (2) smokeless fuel

The **fuel** scarcity most severely impacted the manufacturing sector

### austerity

n. the state or condition of being stern, rigid, or uncompromising, or being simple or plain; an economic policy or measure that seeks to reduce government spending and debt

shift

#### sustained

adj. lasting for a long time or continuing for a long time without becoming weaker or less intense

synonym: prolonged, extended, continual

# politician
