synonym: scoundrel, rogue, antagonist

### adaptable

adj. able or willing to modify or be modified to deal with new situations

synonym: flexible, adjustable, elastic

(1) adaptable enough for the environment, (2) an adaptable person

We seek a candidate who possesses adaptable fighting potential.

# superpower

a country or nation that has significant global influence or formidable military, economic, or technological strength; a supernatural ability or force capable of extraordinary feats or feats beyond normal human capabilities

synonym: great power, empire, hegemony

- (1) **superpower** country, (2) **superpower** leader The ability to fly like a bird is often considered a **superpower** in comic books and movies.
- to eject saliva or other liquid from the mouth synonym: expectorate, saliva, spew
- (1) spit a bullet, (2) spit a mouthful of saliva She tried to **spit** out the gum that she had been chewing.

**RNA** 

spit

(an acronym for Ribonucleic Acid) a type of nucleic acid n. molecule present in living cells, which plays a crucial role in various biological processes, such as coding, decoding, regulation, and expression of genes

synonym: ribonucleic acid

(1) RNA synthesis, (2) transfer RNA

RNA molecules can fold into complex three-dimensional structures, enabling them to carry out various biological functions.

excite

- to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

#### medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of diseasesynonym: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

#### bloodstream

- *n.* the blood flowing through the body
- (1) **bloodstream** in an artery, (2) **bloodstream** to the brain Cancer cells are often carried throughout the body by the **bloodstream**.

# degrade

v. to make something worse, especially in quality; to show or treat someone in a way that makes them seem no value and do not have the respect or reasonable opinion of others

synonym: demean, disgrace, impair

(1) **degrade** his public image, (2) **degrade** environmental quality

You should not **degrade** yourself by allowing them to use you.

# whop

- v. to strike forcefully; to beat or batter
- synonym: hit, smack, bash
- (1) **whop** my opponent, (2) **whop** the intruding spider He gave the punching bag a hard **whop** with his fists.

#### chemo

 short for chemotherapy, a treatment for cancer that uses drugs to destroy cancer cells

synonym: chemotherapy, antineoplastic

(1) chemo patient, (2) chemo-radiotherapy

The side effects of **chemo**, such as nausea and hair loss, were a major concern for the patient.

# penetrate

v. to pass into or through something, often by overcoming resistance

synonym: pierce, stab, go through

(1) **penetrate** a cell, (2) **penetrate** quickly into the skin Western ideology slowly **penetrates** through the eastern countries.

# nanoparticle

- a particle of matter that is between 1 and 100 nanometres (nm) in diameter
- (1) aluminum **nanoparticle**, (2) atmospheric **nanoparticle**For some creatures, carbon **nanoparticles** are deadly.

#### nanoscale

- adj. on a scale that can be measured in nanometres (= one billionth of a meter); on a very small scale
- (1) **nanoscale** device, (2) things at the **nanoscale**This process improves the strength of the metal by controlling the **nanoscale** lattice structure of the metal.

# posit

v. to suggest or accept something as fact or as a basis for argument or consideration

synonym: assert, declare, assume

(1) **posit** the existence of life after death, (2) **posit** the premise

We should **posit** several hypotheses to discuss the matter.

#### sneak

 to go somewhere, or take someone or something somewhere secretly or stealthily; to steal or do something secretly or stealthily

synonym: creep, tiptoe, smuggle

(1) **sneak** a cigarette, (2) **sneak** out of danger The children tried to **sneak** out and eat the candy.

disguise

 to hide or alter someone's appearance to deceive or mislead others

synonym: mask, misinterpret, cloak

(1) **disguise** my feelings, (2) **disguise** his voice Later it turned out that the politician **disguised** the fact from the public.

# hydrate

v. to add water or moisture to something; to drink enough fluids to maintain proper moisture; (noun) any compound that contains water of crystallization

synonym: moisturize, water, rehydrate

(1) hydrate my skin, (2) acid hydrate

She drank water to **hydrate** her body.

#### saccharide

 a simple sugar or carbohydrate; any compound that can be hydrolyzed to yield sugars

synonym: sugar, carbohydrate, sweetener

(1) saccharide molecule, (2) complex saccharide

Cellulose is a structural **saccharide** found in the cell walls of plants.

#### cloak

a type of loose, outer garment worn over the shoulders and fastened at the neck, often with a hood; something that covers or conceals something else; a mask or disguise

synonym: cape, mantle, shroud

(1) cloak room, (2) hooded cloak

The magician seemed to disappear when he threw his **cloak** over himself.

#### nanostructure

- a structure that falls in between microscopic and molecular in size
- (1) **nanostructure** material, (2) three-dimensional **nanostructure**

This feature of the material is a result of its **nanostructure**.

# doxing

 the act of searching for and publishing private or identifying information about a particular individual on the internet, often with malicious intent

synonym: cyberstalking, cyberbullying

(1) the potential risk of **doxing**, (2) laws against **doxing** The celebrity became a victim of **doxing**, resulting in her personal details being publicly revealed.

#### regress

 to move or develop backward; to return to an earlier or less advanced state or condition; to decline or deteriorate

synonym: retrovert, deteriorate, decline

(1) regress to childhood, (2) regress in skills

The team's failure to win games has caused them to **regress** in confidence.

#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

*synonym*: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

# ovary

- either of the pair of organs in the female reproductive system that produces eggs; (of a plant) the organ that bears the ovules of a flower
- (1) **ovary** atrophy, (2) salted **ovary** of walleye pollack They found **ovary** cancer in an early stage.

# optimism

n. a feeling or the belief that good things will happen, or the quality of being full of hope and emphasizing the positive aspects of a situation

synonym: positiveness, sanguinity, bullishness

(1) sense of **optimism**, (2) political **optimism**There is considerable **optimism** that the economy will recover soon.

# neurological

adj. of or relating to the science of neurology or the nervous system

synonym: nervous, neural, brain-related

(1) fever with **neurological** signs, (2) **neurological** symptoms

The patient was diagnosed with a neurological disorder
