## ecosystem

- all the plants and living creatures in an area and the way they affect each other and the environment

## destroy

## geography

## diversity

## biodiversity

#### pioneer

inventor; explorer; someone who is among the first to achieve something

## priority

#### **Atlantic**

- adj. relating to or located near the Atlantic Ocean, which is the second-largest ocean on Earth, located between the continents of North and South America to the west and Europe and Africa to the east

#### threaten

#### biome

 a major ecological community characterized by particular plant and animal species adapted to a specific climate and geographic region, such as desert, tundra, or rainforest

The rainforest is one of the most diverse **biomes** on the planet.

#### destruction

- n. the act of causing so much damage to somethingsynonym: devastation, annihilation, ruin

#### colonize

 to establish a colony in or on a specific place; to settle or occupy in large numbers

#### timber

## agriculture

 the practice or science of cultivating the land or raising stock

cattle

 cows, bulls, and buffalos that are raised for their milk or meat as farm animals

synonym: cows, herd, oxen

### ranching

 the practice of raising livestock, typically cattle or sheep, on large areas of land, often referred to as ranches, for meat, wool, or other products

synonym: farming, agriculture, grazing

#### construct

v. to build or create something; to assemble or combine different parts to form something whole

#### isolate

v. to physically or socially separate someone or something from other people or things

#### disconnect

v. to unfasten or disjoin something, especially to break the connection between a supply of gas, water, or electricity and a piece of equipment

#### pastureland

 an area of land covered with grass used for grazing livestock

## identify

 to recognize someone or something and say or prove who or what they are

synonym: determine, specify, recognize

wildlife

- animals, birds, insects, etc. that grow independently of people and live in natural conditions
- wildlife sanctuary, (2) bird and other wildlife
   The conservation area has an abundance of wildlife.

#### corridor

 a hallway or passageway, especially one connecting rooms or areas within a building or structure

synonym: hallway, passageway, aisle

(1) walk along a **corridor**, (2) air **corridor**The long **corridor** was filled with people rushing to get to their rooms before the meeting began.

#### reconnect

- v. to connect again after a break or interruption synonym: reopen, rejoin, link up

#### expand

v. to increase or to make something greater in size, number, or importance

## floodplain

 an area of flat land adjacent to a river or stream that is subject to periodic flooding

synonym: lowland, swamp, delta

#### incredible

## stronghold

## reproduction

## grassland

 a large area of land covered mainly by grass, with few or no trees, and typically used for grazing livestock

synonym: meadow, plain, savanna

(1) endangered grassland, (2) vast grassland

Meadows and pastures are examples of smaller-scale **grasslands** in many parts of the world.

#### shrub

 a woody plant that is smaller than a tree and has several main stems emerging from the soil

### epicenter

 the point on the earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake


