### revoke

## patchwork

elite

adj. belonging to the wealthiest, most potent, best-educated, or best-trained group in a society

## sacrifice

assignment

 a duty or task given to someone, usually as part of their job or studies

beneath

adv. in or to a lower place than someone or something

synonym: down, under, low

(1) the ground **beneath** my feet, (2) **beneath** contempt

A great stretch of the lake lay **beneath** them.

temporarily

adv. for a limited time only or not permanently

*synonym*: for a time

(1) a hut made temporarily, (2) temporarily suspend the

Some athletes take anabolic steroids to increase muscle size

temporarily.

labor

n. productive work, especially physical work done for wages; the people who do manual or physical work in a country or company for wage; (verb) to work hard or to strive and make an effort to reach a goal

synonym: toil, moil, donkeywork

(1) seasonal labor, (2) manual labor

In several countries, child **labor** is a serious social problem.

## eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

*synonym*: finally, someday, ultimately

(1) **eventually** become obsolete, (2) **eventually** succeed The corporation **eventually** dominated the entire tobacco business.

## quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

## flip

 to turn over into a different position quickly; to throw or toss with a light motion

*synonym*: throw, jump

## urge

v. to spur on or encourage someone, especially by cheers and shouts; (noun) a strong desire or impulse, especially one that is difficult to control or resist

The lobbyist urged Congress not to approve the measure.

## diagnose

v. to determine or distinguish the nature of a problem or an illness through a careful analysis

synonym: identify, analyze, interpret

## paranoid

## schizophrenia

 a severe mental disorder in which a person has a distorted view of reality and may experience hallucinations, delusions, and disordered thinking and behavior

## spite

feelings of anger and resentment; (in spite of, also despite) a phrase that is used to indicate that something happened or exists even though there is a particular obstacle or difficulty

synonym: malice, ill will, vindictiveness

(1) bear **spite** against him, (2) die in **spite** of intensive care He did it out of **spite**, to annoy me.

brilliance

 the quality of being very clever or talented; the quality of being very bright or shining

synonym: splendor, glory, luster

(1) **brilliance** of diamond, (2) economic **brilliance**The scientist's **brilliance** led to many groundbreaking discoveries in his field.

cuckoo

 a bird of the Cuculidae family, known for its distinctive call; (informally) a person who is crazy, eccentric, or foolish

*synonym*: loony, nut, madcap

cuckoo clock, (2) cuckoo in the nest
 The cuckoo bird's call echoed through the forest.

nest

n. a structure in which animals lay their eggs or give birth to their young

synonym: roost, perch, burrow

(1) bird's **nest**, (2) a **nest** of thieves

The female birds build a **nest** and lay their eggs in May.

rough

adj. not quite exact or correct; having or caused by an irregular surface

synonym: inelegant, coarse, barbarian

(1) **rough** and tough, (2) **rough** estimation

The vehicle bounced along the **rough** mountain road.

motto

a phrase or slogan that expresses a guiding principle or goal

synonym: slogan, catchphrase, phrase

(1) the **motto** for safe traffic, (2) company **motto** 

The company's **motto** is "Innovation and Service," which is reflected in its products and customer support.

relation

 the way two persons or groups of people feel and act toward one another

synonym: association, linkage, connection

(1) **relation** between cause and effect, (2) **relation** of inclusion

The industrial **relations** laws were passed with little to no alteration.

poverty

n. the condition of being extremely poor

synonym: deprivation, destitution, poorness

(1) **poverty** alleviation, (2) the cycle of **poverty** 

Many studies have investigated the relationship between **poverty** and academic achievement.

abandon

v. to leave a place, thing, or person with no intention of returning; (noun) a feeling of extreme emotional intensity

synonym: relinquish, leave behind, disregard

(1) **abandon** a friend, (2) **abandon** the practice The castle was **abandoned** several years later.

## disability

- a physical or mental condition that makes it difficult for someone to do some things that other people do
   synonym: impairment, disadvantage, restriction

## alcoholism

 a chronic disorder characterized by dependence on alcohol and repeated excessive use of alcoholic beverages

## violent

adj. involving or caused by physical force or aggression against someone or something

### conventional

adj. based on or following traditional rules, standards, customs, etc.

synonym: ancestral, customary, established

## trauma

 an emotional wound or shock often has long-lasting effects caused by a highly upsetting or shocking experience

synonym: agony, injury, ordeal

(1) psychic **trauma**, (2) **trauma** care

Many civilians have suffered **trauma** as a result of the war.

#### distress

- a feeling of great worry, sadness, pain, or discomfort synonym: discomfort, despair, misery
- (1) a signal of **distress**, (2) emotional **distress** She has been in great **distress** since she was heartbroken.

## dysfunction

rev

a problem or fault in a system, organism, or part of the body or machine

synonym: malfunction, disorder, disfunction

- (1) **dysfunction** of kidneys, (2) brain **dysfunction** The **dysfunction** in the relationship was causing problems for both partners.
- a measure of the rate at which an engine or motor rotates, often expressed in revolutions per minute (RPM); (verb) to increase the number of rotations per minute

synonym: revolution, RPM, speed

(1) low- rev engine, (2) rev up the crowd He stepped on the gas pedal, and the engine released a loud rev.

## unexpected

adj. not anticipated or regarded as likely to happen synonym: surprising, unanticipated, incredible

## insight

the ability to gain an accurate and deep understanding of people or situations; an accurate and deep understanding of what something is like

synonym: wisdom, discernment, understanding

(1) a profound **insight**, (2) share my **insights** We gained various **insights** by analyzing the vast amount of data owned by the company.

the specific conditions or events that surround a particular situation or occurrence

*synonym*: condition, context, environment

circumstance

# (1) **circumstance** of birth, (2) **circumstance** of injury She explained the **circumstances** surrounding the accident.

## transformation

n. a complete change in form, nature, or appearance of someone or something

synonym: change, conversion, renewal

(1) the **transformation** of a tadpole into a frog, (2) cast a **transformation** spell

Understanding unitary **transformations** of a normal matrix require considerable mathematical sophistication.

#### remarkable

*adj.* worthy of attention because unusual or special *synonym*: outstanding, exceptional, extraordinary

(1) **remarkable** achievement, (2) the **remarkable** breadth of knowledge

The election was a **remarkable** success for the Whigs.

## counterintuitive

adj. contrary to what common sense would suggest synonym: unreasonable, paradoxical, nonsensical

(1) **counterintuitive** results, (2) **counterintuitive** behavior The **counterintuitive** nature of quantum physics has been a source of confusion for scientists for decades.

## phenomenon

something that exists and can be perceptible, especially one that is not fully understood

synonym: marvel, wonder, splendor

(1) natural phenomenon,(2) historical phenomenonA rainbow is a natural phenomenon.

## discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

(1) a scientific **discovery**, (2) the great **discovery** of the century

Her research team made an important discovery.

## traumatic

adj. relating to or caused by injury, especially emotional injury

synonym: distressing

(1) traumatic event, (2) traumatic brain injury

The experience was so **traumatic** that it left a lasting impact on the survivor's mental health.

## adversity

- n. difficulties or hardships that someone faces
- synonym: hardship, difficulty, trial

#### subset

 a set of things that are contained within another larger set; a portion or division of a group or category

synonym: subcategory, subdivision

#### severe

adj. extremely serious or bad in feeling, manner, or strict and harsh; extremely strong or vigorous

#### extreme

adj. very great in amount or degree

synonym: farthermost, outermost, fierce

(1) **extreme** sports, (2) **extreme** weather events

## adoption

 the action or fact of legally taking another's child as one's own; the act of accepting with approval

synonym: fostering, acceptance, custody

(1) adoption assistance, (2) the adoption of a plan

The adoption process can be long and difficult, but it is worth

it for the love of a child.

## sojourn

 to stay for a short time in a particular place; (noun) a temporary stay

synonym: visit, stay, reside

(1) a place of **sojourn**, (2) **sojourn** in the historical city After graduating, he decided to **sojourn** in Europe for a few months before starting work.

## dyslexia

n. a neurological condition that affects a person's ability to read, write, and spell, often despite normal or above-average intelligence, effective teaching, and adequate motivation, which is characterized by difficulty in the phonological coding of written words, poor phonological awareness, and poor reading fluency and decoding skills

synonym: reading disability, word blindness, dysgraphia

## entrepreneur

 an individual who creates or invests in one or more businesses, especially when this involves taking financial risks

## disproportionate

## desirable

adj. worth having or achieving; pleasing, attractive, or sought after

## embrace

## develop

grit

 very small pieces of stone or sand; mental toughness and determination or perseverance in the face of challenges or obstacles

synonym: determination, fortitude, courage

She has a lot of **grit** and determination to succeed.

## upend

v. to turn or flip over; to overthrow or upset the established order

synonym: overturn, upset, invert

(1) **upend** a table, (2) **upend** a tradition

The sudden news **upended** their plans for the weekend.

#### revolution

 a large-scale attempt to overthrow the government of a country, often using violence or war;

synonym: coup, innovation, rebellion

## relocate

## landscape

an expanse of scenery that can be seen in a single view;

## curriculum

 a series of subjects comprising a course of study in a school, college, etc.

## nap

n. a short sleep, especially during the day

synonym: rest, doze, drowse

## commitment

## unwavering
