communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

tribe

 a social group made up of members who live together, sharing the same language, culture, religion, etc., especially those who do not live in towns or cities

synonym: family, clan, kinsfolk

lab

 a workplace for the conduct of scientific research; a laboratory

cage

 a structure made of metal bars or wire in which birds or animals can be kept

maintain

 to continue to uphold or sustain; to keep in a particular state or condition; to assert or declare something to be true

synonym: preserve, uphold, sustain

symptom

 any sensation or change in body or mind that is experienced by a patient and is associated with a particular disease

synonym: sign, manifestation, syndrome

indefinitely

 adv. without any fixed or definite limit; for an unknown or unspecified period of time

murder

- n. the crime of killing somebody intentionallysynonym: slaying, killing

process


