#### munition

n. weapons and ammunition used by soldiers or military forces; the tools, materials, or equipment used in the preparation or use of weapons and ammunition

synonym: armament, weaponry, ordnance

(1) munitions factory, (2) military munitions

The soldiers had stored their **munitions** in a secure bunker.

#### reassure

v. to cause someone to feel sure; to give or restore confidence

synonym: comfort, soothe, bolster

(1) **reassure** anxious patients, (2) **reassure** market The pilot tried to **reassure** the customers that the planes were safe.

# displace

v. to force someone or something to leave their home or place of origin, especially as a result of conflict, natural disaster, or manipulation

synonym: evict, exile, remove

(1) **displace** workers, (2) **displace** the explosive power The construction of the new dam will **displace** hundreds of families living downstream.

### inflexible

adj. not able to be changed or adapted; rigid or unyielding synonym: rigid, unyielding, unadaptable

(1) **inflexible** rule, (2) take an **inflexible** stance His **inflexible** schedule did not allow for any changes.

# prosthetic

- adj. of or relating to an artificial part of the body, such as a limb, a heart, or a breast implant
- have prosthetic arms, (2) prosthetic limbs
   New prosthetic joints are less prone to metal poisoning.

#### indiscriminate

- adj. done or occurring without any particular aim, purpose, or discrimination; haphazard, random, or carelesssynonym: random, haphazard, eclectic
- (1) **indiscriminate** violence, (2) **indiscriminate** use of force The **indiscriminate** spraying of pesticides is harmful to both the environment and people's health.

#### midair

- n. some point in the air; above ground level
- (1) a midair collision, (2) thrown out into midair

She flawlessly performed a midair somersault.

#### scatter

- v. to cause to separate and go in different directions synonym: disperse, spread, bestrew
- (1) **scatter** seeds, (2) **scatter** around the internet The hunter's approach **scattered** the geese.

### explode

v. to burst or break open violently and noisily; to cause something to burst or break open

synonym: detonate, blast, rupture

(1) **explode** in anger, (2) **explode** in popularity The old building **exploded** in a fiery inferno.

#### landmine

 an explosive device hidden underground and designed to be detonated by the presence, proximity, or contact with a person or vehicle

synonym: mine, explosive device, antipersonnel mine

(1) destroy a **landmine**, (2) **landmine** removal

The antipersonnel **landmine** was a dangerous obstacle in the war-torn area.

# physiotherapy

n. (also physio) a branch of healthcare that focuses on the prevention, management, and rehabilitation of disabilities, injuries, and illnesses through physical exercises, massage, and other therapeutic techniques

synonym: physical therapy, rehab, rehabilitation

(1) **physiotherapy** equipment, (2) pediatric **physiotherapy** The **physiotherapy** sessions helped the patient recover from the injury and regain mobility.

#### threefold

- adj. three times as great or as many synonym: three, triple, three times
- (1) rise nearly **threefold**, (2) **threefold** increase

  The price of the item was reduced **threefold** after the sale.

#### embarrass

v. to cause someone to feel awkward, worried, or ashamed synonym: disconcert, unsettle, agitate

(1) **embarrass** political enemy, (2) **embarrass** my project He looked for an opportunity to **embarrass** that actor in public.

#### scar

 a mark that remains on the skin after a wound has healed

synonym: blemish, imperfection, blotch

(1) burn scar, (2) carry a scar

Even after the wound has healed, a scar remains.

#### obsession

- synonym: compulsion, fixation, enthusiasm

#### embark

# lifesaving

- the act or process of rescuing someone else's life, especially from drowning

### stockpile

stockpile weapons, (2) nuclear stockpile

#### contaminate

v. to make something impure, unclean, or poisonous by contact or mixture

synonym: defile, pollute, adulterate

### casualty

 a person who has been killed or injured in a war, accident, or other disasters; a victim

synonym: victim, injured, fatality

#### illiterate

adj. unable to read or write; lacking basic education and knowledge in reading and writing

synonym: unlettered, uneducated, unschooled
