gnaw

altruism

n. the belief or practice of disinterested and selfless concern for the well-being of others; unselfish devotion to the welfare of others often expressed as acts of kindness or charity

synonym: selflessness, philanthropy, generosity

interstate

 adj. between or involving different states (= the territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation)

dart

 a small narrow pointed object, sometimes with feathers to help it fly, that is thrown or shot; (verb) to move along rapidly and lightly

suppose

- v. to think that something is likely to be actual or possible synonym: guess, assume, presume

swerve

v. to change direction suddenly, often to avoid something or to turn sharply

synonym: veer, deviate, curve

discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

spin

v. to cause something to rotate rapidly; to cause someone to feel dizzy or disoriented

synonym: rotate, twirl, swirl

backward

adv. at, to, or toward the direction or place that is behind or rear

oncoming

adj. approaching or moving toward a particular person or place; relating to something that is coming toward the

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observer

engine

 a machine that converts thermal energy to mechanical work; something that has an important role used to achieve a purpose

brave

adj. showing courage or fearlessness in the face of danger, difficulty, or adversity

develop

v. to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

extreme

adj. very great in amount or degreesynonym: farthermost, outermost, fierce

aspect

- n. one part or feature of a situation, problem, subject, etc.synonym: characteristic, element, factor

philosophy

- the study of general and fundamental questions, such as those about existence, reason, knowledge, values, mind

antisocial

institute

conduct

psychopathic

emotion

- a strong feeling such as love, anger, etc. deriving from one's situation, mood, or relationships with others

distress

- n. a feeling of great worry, sadness, pain, or discomfortsynonym: discomfort, despair, misery

convey

synonym: communicate, transfer, deliver

urgent

adj. requiring immediate attention or action; pressing *synonym*: pressing, critical, immediate

(1) an **urgent** telegram, (2) **urgent** situation It is **urgent** that we leave for the airport now to catch our flight.

emotional

adj. relating to people's feelings

synonym: affecting, impactful, impressive

(1) **emotional** health, (2) **emotional** distress

Human **emotional** responses vary widely depending on the society to which they belong.

elicit

v. to obtain information or a reaction from someone, usually with difficulty

synonym: bring out, obtain, evoke

(1) **elicit** a confession, (2) **elicit** a solution

Have you **elicited** a response from them yet?

cue

 a signal, gesture, or action that provides information or direction for someone else to act or respond; a reminder or prompt for someone to do something

synonym: signal, sign, hint

(1) cue card, (2) visual cue

The director gave the actor a **cue** to begin the scene.

amygdala

- one of two parts of the almond-shaped neural structure that are linked to emotions, especially fear and pleasure, memory, and the sense of smell

profoundly

adv. to a great or complete degree; deeply

spike

 a narrow, thin, pointed piece of metal, wood, etc.; a sudden large increase in the magnitude or concentration of something

synonym: end, spindle, point

(1) to **spike**, (2) to prevent blood sugar **spikes**

The recent **spike** in grain prices is partly due to the war in the producing countries.

react

v. to take action in response to something

synonym: respond, reply, oppose

(1) **react** at a high temperature, (2) **react** against his way of thinking

detect

fin

v. to find or recognize something, especially something difficult to see, hear, etc.

synonym: catch, observe, notice

- (1) **detect** a bad event, (2) **detect** smuggling across borders The security camera has **detected** four intruders.
- n. a thin flat part on the body of a fish or other aquatic animal used for propulsion or balance

synonym: flipper, appendage, stabilizer

(1) back fin, (2) a fin of a plane

The shark's powerful **fins** allowed it to swim at high speeds.

robust

adj. sturdy and healthy in form, constitution, or construction;
 strong enough to withstand or overcome intellectual
 challenges or adversity

synonym: healthy, strong, booming

(1) **robust** growth, (2) a **robust** appetite

The experiment yielded **robust** results that support his theory.

emerge

v. to move out of or away from something and become visible

synonym: arise, occur, appear

- (1) **emerge** as a butterfly, (2) **emerge** from poverty During colonial eras, new migratory patterns **emerged**.
- a person who has an unselfish or selfless concern for the welfare of others; a person who values the well-being of others over their interests or desires

synonym: benefactor, philanthropist, donor

(1) charitable altruist, (2) an altruistic act

The wealthy philanthropist was known as an altruistic

altruist

individual who donated generously to many charities.

kidney

- n. either of a pair of small organs in the body that filter waste products, especially urea, from the blood and excrete them and water in urine

volunteer

 a person who performs or offers to perform a job or service without being paid for or forced to do

undergo

v. to go through something unpleasant or that involves a change

surgery

medical treatment of injuries or diseases involving an incision with instruments and often removing or replacing some parts of the body; the branch of medical science that treats disease or injury by operative procedures

synonym: operation, (medical) procedure

cardiac surgery, (2) the professor of surgery
 He had undergone heart surgery years before.

transplant

v. to move or transfer something from one place or person to another; to take living tissue or an organ from one person, animal, part of the body, etc. and put it into or onto another

synonym: relocate, emigrate, graft

(1) **transplant** a heart, (2) **transplant** my family to America He tried to **transplant** the seedling into a larger pot.

continuum

n. a series of similar items in which no part or portion is distinct or distinguishable from adjacent parts

synonym: continuation, continuity

(1) a space-time **continuum**, (2) the **continuum** of events Our life is a **continuum** of experience in which events pass from the future through the present to the past.

anchor

n. a device, typically made of metal, that is used to moor a ship or boat in a particular place, typically by being dropped to the seabed; a central cohesive source of support and stability

synonym: mainstay, ballast, backbone

compassionate

adj. feeling or showing sympathy and concern for the suffering or bad luck of others

innermost

 adj. situated or occurring at the deepest or most central part or point; relating to one's deepest or most private thoughts, feelings, or experiences

identify

 to recognize someone or something and say or prove who or what they are

synonym: determine, specify, recognize

(1) **identify** handwriting, (2) **identify** gene sequences I will introduce you to how to **identify** the leading causes of the malfunction.

extend

- v. to broaden in scope, range, or area synonym: prolong, lengthen, advance
- (1) **extend** the warranty, (2) **extend** a line Her visit will **extend** from Monday to Friday.

acquaintance

- n. a person one knows but who is not a close friend synonym: friend, associate, contact
- (1) **acquaintance** with a language, (2) business **acquaintance**

I met him at a party, and we quickly became acquaintances.

opportune

- adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose
- synonym: suitable, timely, practical

donor

- n. a person or an organization that makes a gift of money, food, supplies, etc. to a cause or fund; in medicine, a person who gives blood or tissue or an organ to be used in another person

inherent

- adj. existing in something as a permanent, essential, or characteristic attribute

Don

- a Spanish gentleman; a university lecturer, especially a senior member of a college at Oxford or Cambridge

amazing

adj. extremely surprising, especially in a way that you like or admire

synonym: exceptional, extraordinary, wonderful

humility

angel

the quality or condition of being humble; a low estimate of one's self

synonym: humbleness, modesty, unpretentiousness

- (1) develop an attitude of **humility**, (2) lack of **humility** We were filled with **humility** at the sight of the Queen.
- a spiritual being believed to be a messenger of God often depicted as having wings and a halo synonym: messenger, spirit, celestial being

distinguish

to notice or understand the difference between two people or things

synonym: determine, differentiate, characterize

attain

expansion
