*synonym*: spring back, resile, recover

#### vaccinate

v. to treat with a vaccine, usually by injection, to produce immunity against a disease

*synonym*: immunize, inject, inoculate

The nurse **vaccinated** the children in the school.

#### chant

 a simple melody or tune, typically one that is repeated or sung in a monotonous way; (verb) recite with musical intonation

synonym: hymn, mantra, (verb) recite

(1) **chant** melodies, (2) **chant** in the chapel

The soccer game crowd broke into a chant of "Go, team, go!"

#### tenet

n. one of the fundamental ideas or beliefs upon which a theory or broader group of views is founded

synonym: dogma, creed, principle

(1) basic **tenets**, (2) a fundamental **tenet** of Judaism This section explains a central **tenet** of economics.

### counterproductive

*adj.* having the opposite effect to the one intended or wanted *synonym*: ineffective, inadequate, inefficient

(1) **counterproductive** approach, (2) highly **counterproductive** to performance

Territorial disputes between different countries are entirely **counterproductive** but common.

#### innovate

- v. to introduce new methods, ideas, or products synonym: bring in, introduce, found
- (1) **innovate** a new method, (2) **innovate** the quality of his life

Companies developing self-driving cars consistently **innovate** the emerging technologies.

## trinity

 the union of three people, especially the Christian doctrine of the three persons in one Godhead (the father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit)

synonym: triad, triune, three-in-one

(1) trinity doctrine, (2) the Blessed Trinity

The Christian doctrine of the Holy **Trinity** states that there is one God in three persons.

#### derail

to cause a train or tram to run off the tracks accidentally;
 to run off or leave the rails accidentally

synonym: crash, wreck, thwart

(1) **derail** the recovery, (2) **derail** an argument The train **derailed** because a cow was standing on the tracks.

#### animate

- v. to make something full of interest and energy synonym: invigorate, energize, enliven
- (1) **animate** the body, (2) **animate** his soul The positive attitude of the supervisor **animated** the discussion.

#### narrate

v. to tell a story or give an account of events, often in a chronological or logical sequence; to provide a voiceover or commentary for a film or other media

synonym: tell, recount, describe

(1) **narrate** a news article, (2) **narrate** an event The audiobook hired a professional actor to **narrate** the story, making it more engaging for listeners.

#### narration

 the act or process of telling a story; the relating of a story or account

synonym: story-telling, recital, account

(1) narration of events, (2) exaggerate in narrationHis narration of the story was engaging and captivating.

#### exaggerate

v. to describe or represent something as better or worse than it is

synonym: overstate, overestimate, amplify

(1) **exaggerate** in degree, (2) **exaggerate** story

She **exaggerated** the extent of her injuries to get more money from the settlement.

## archaeology

- the branch of anthropology that studies prehistoric people and their cultures
- (1) the institute of **archaeology**, (2) prehistoric **archaeology** She teaches **archaeology** at the local university.

#### baton

n. a thin stick or rod used as a conductor's wand, a symbol of authority, or a tool for specific sports or activities; a short, straight, light stick that is passed from runner to runner in a relay race

synonym: staff, stick, wand

#### grail

- a sacred or highly prized object, often associated with a quest or search for something elusive or unattainable
   synonym: chalice, treasure, quest

The search for the **grail** is often used as a metaphor for any difficult quest or task.

#### dedicate

 to give all of your energy, time, etc., entirely to a specific person, activity, or cause; to set apart for a particular purpose or use

synonym: consecrate, devote, commit

He dedicated his life to helping others.

#### mobilize

v. to make something ready for action or use; to organize people or resources for a particular purpose

synonym: activate, rally, marshal

(1) **mobilize** cooperation, (2) **mobilize** a stiff joint The military **mobilized** troops to the border.

#### deteriorate

- v. to become worse in quality; to decline or degenerate synonym: decline, degenerate, regress
- (1) **deteriorate** at a slow pace, (2) **deteriorate** condition The patient's health **deteriorated** rapidly after being diagnosed with the disease.

#### redo

v. to do again, usually to correct or improve upon a previous attempt; to renovate or redesign something to make it better or more suitable

synonym: revise, remake, rework

(1) **redo** a kitchen, (2) **redo** a project

#### mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

synonym: attitude, ethos, mentality

(1) flexible **mindset**, (2) the **mindset** in an education system

Countries whose goal is economic development often focus on fostering an entrepreneurial **mindset** in each individual.

## hinge

a joint that holds the edge of a door, window, lid, etc.
 and allows it to open or close

synonym: joint, pivot

(1) a stiff hinge,(2) insecure hingeHis involvement is the hinge of our plan.
