dread

synonym: fear, cringe, apprehend

(1) dread failure, (2) dread getting old

We all **dread** to think about what will happen if the company goes bankrupt.

curveball

 a pitch in baseball that breaks unexpectedly; a surprising or unexpected twist or turn in a situation

synonym: surprise, twist, deviation

(1) life's little curveball, (2) curveball situation

The pitcher threw a sharp **curveball** that the batter was not expecting.

autoimmune

- adj. relating to a condition in which the body's immune system attacks and destroys healthy body tissue, mistaking it for harmful foreign substances
- (1) insulin **autoimmune** syndrome, (2) **autoimmune** disorder

The presence of certain substances triggered the **autoimmune** response.

drip

v. to fall in drops or make it fall in drops; (noun) liquid or moisture that falls in drops

synonym: drop, drizzle, trickle

scramble

v. to move or climb quickly and awkwardly, often using your hands to help you

synonym: jumble, disarrange

Local business owners **scrambled** to find skilled workers.

sizzle

v. to make a hissing or crackling sound, especially when something is cooking in a pan

synonym: crackle, hiss, pop

(1) **sizzle** in the distance, (2) **sizzle** in the pan

The hot metal **sizzled** as it hit the water, creating steam.

underestimate

v. to think or suppose that a quantity, price, or size is smaller than it is

synonym: underrate, misjudge, miscalculate

(1) **underestimate** an enemy, (2) **underestimate** the probability

They frequently **underestimated** their abilities and felt inferior.

mistakenly

adv. in a mistaken or incorrect way; wrongly synonym: incorrectly, erroneously, wrongly

(1) **mistakenly** left his keys, (2) **mistakenly** delete the important file

He **mistakenly** thought the red liquid was juice, but it was paint.

aback

adv. to be very surprised or shocked by somebody or something

synonym: surprised, astounded, shocked

The sudden news of the merger took me aback.

heartbreak

- a feeling of great sadness or disappointmentsynonym: grief, sorrow, bitterness
- (1) ease her **heartbreak**, (2) go through **heartbreak**They had experienced the **heartbreak** of losing two children due to premature births.

solver

 a thinker who finds an answer to a problem or a difficult situation; a piece of software or the algorithm that solves a mathematical problem

synonym: thinker

(1) puzzle- solver, (2) linear solver

The flow **solver** is validated against the experiment.

instinctively

adv. as a matter of nature or intuition rather than thought or training

synonym: inherently, intuitively, naturally

(1) **instinctively** grabbed the knife, (2) **instinctively** bad with children

Some researchers claim that even humans can **instinctively** sense earthquakes.

mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

synonym: attitude, ethos, mentality

(1) flexible **mindset**, (2) the **mindset** in an education system

implosion

a sudden and extreme collapse or inward bursting,
particularly of a structure or system; a rapid or explosive reduction in size, quantity, or value
