avert

to prevent something dangerous or undesirable from happening

synonym: discourage, prevent, deter

(1) avert disaster, (2) avert a strike

jealousy

a feeling of resentment or bitterness towards someone because they have something that you desire

synonym: envy, covetousness, resentment

(1) **jealousy** feeling towards another person, (2) burn with jealousy
