### famine

 a severe shortage of food, often caused by drought, war, or economic reasons

*synonym*: hunger, starvation, drought

## porridge

 a hot cereal dish made from boiled grains or legumes, typically oats, rice, or cornmeal, often served with milk or sweeteners

synonym: oatmeal, gruel, mush

A bowl of hot **porridge** is a nutritious breakfast option in winter.

## hesitation

 the act of pausing or being slow before saying or doing something, especially because you feel uncertain or nervous

synonym: unwillingness, indecision, uncertainty

(1) perform without **hesitation**, (2) after some **hesitation** There was a **hesitation** in her speech.

## uplift

n. the process of raising land to a higher elevation, or the result of this process; (verb) fill with high spiritssynonym: upthrust, upheaval, (verb) raise

(1) **uplift** mountains, (2) **uplift** my spirit

The **uplift** in the stock market has been a relief to investors.

## unequal

adj. different in amount, size, degree, or value; not fair synonym: unfair, uneven, imbalanced

(1) **unequal** distribution, (2) **unequal** opportunity

The income inequality in the country is becoming increasingly **unequal**.

## consciously

adv. with awareness; in a deliberate manner synonym: intentionally, deliberately, knowingly

(1) **consciously** aware of a problem, (2) act **consciously** He **consciously** criticizes her in the publicity.

## opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purposesynonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

## visionary

- adj. having or showing exceptional foresight and imagination; not practical or realizable; speculativesynonym: prophetic, far-sighted, imaginative
- (1) **visionary** business, (2) **visionary** ideas
  The **visionary** leader had a clear plan for the company's future.

## groundbreaking

adj. producing fresh findings; using novel techniquessynonym: innovative, revolutionary

(1) **groundbreaking** concept, (2) **groundbreaking** settlement

He has produced groundbreaking research on the subject.

#### inflection

 a change in the pitch or tone of one's voice; a change in the form of a word to indicate tense, mood, gender, or other grammatical categories

synonym: accent, intonation, modulation

(1) **inflection** in voice, (2) **inflection** pattern

The linguist studied the **inflection** of the language's inflection in speech.

#### mobilize

v. to make something ready for action or use; to organize people or resources for a particular purpose

synonym: activate, rally, marshal

(1) **mobilize** cooperation, (2) **mobilize** a stiff joint The military **mobilized** troops to the border.

#### madam

 a term of polite address or title used to address a woman, particularly one in a position of authority or respect

synonym: lady, ma'am, madame

(1) madam speaker, (2) dear madam

## compel

v. to force or require someone to do something; to exert a strong, irresistible force or pressure that makes someone act in a certain way

synonym: force, oblige, coerce

- (1) **compel** a person to submission, (2) **compel** attention The strict deadlines will **compel** the team to work efficiently.
- institutionalize
- to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

*synonym*: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

#### elector

- n. a person who has the right to vote in an electionsynonym: voter, constituent, citizen
- presidential elector,
   qualified for an elector
   the elector cast their vote for the candidate they believed in.

### garner

v. to acquire or accumulate something through effort or attention

synonym: acquire, collect, obtain

(1) **garner** good reviews, (2) **garner** attention He used his charm and charisma to **garner** support for his campaign.

## delusion

 a false belief or impression that is firmly held despite evidence to the contrary

synonym: hallucination, illusion, fantasy

(1) grand **delusion**, (2) labor under a **delusion** He had a **delusion** that he was a millionaire.

## widen

to become or make something broader, wider, more extensive

synonym: broaden, enlarge, extend

(1) **widen** in excitement, (2) **widen** a narrowed heart valve He **widened** his investigation into a medical clinic.
